The appeal for cheaper antitoxin to save the lives of hundreds of children who contract-diptheria has now been answered. Dr. Herman Spalding, the chief medical inspector of the city, hopes it will not be long before the remedy is within the reach of even the poorest citizens.

The McCormick Menserial Institute for infectious diseases is supplying the city with antitoxin at less than hilf the price charged by the antitoxin trust, as Dr. Spalding terms it. The preventive also is being supplied to the Cook County hospital. The antitoxin is being manufactured by the endowed institution on a farm in the outskirts of the city. Dr. Ludwig Hektuen, Professor K. O. Jordan and Dr. George Weaver are in charge of the work—Chiego Chronicol Kimper and Chief and Prof. Jordan and family reside there in the summer.
