WEATHER BULLETIN

For the Week Ending June 18th, General Summary.

Operal Summary.

There was a marked deficiency in the mean temperature for the week ending Monday, June 18, the deficiency averaging about 8 degrees in the central and the northern district, The abnormally cool weather was due to the prevailing northerly winds, and rea of high barometic pressure persisting, over Ontario for several days, together with low pressure in the southern days, together with low pressure in the southeast, contributing to this/condition. At Springfield a low maxium of 60 degrees was recorded on the 14th, this low registration for the season being exceeded only twice in twenty-seven years, namely, 58 degrees in 1899 and 56 degrees in 1901.
