By the decision the contract exacted by the boss bakers by the union mef, by means of which the workmen sought to enforce the closed shop, is held illegal, the trades council and the individual members are enjoined from using the "untair list;" the boycott is declared an actionable conspiracy to accomplish a criminal or unlawful purpose; Baker Schultz is allowed to recover damages of \$2,000 for the loss of profits from the time of the commencement of the boycotting acts up to the time of the trial, and \$3,500 in damages for the amount of injury to his business and property in relation to its selling value.
