Associated Press Men Quit.
Many of the telegraph operators employed throughout the country by the Associated Press went out on strike Monday evening. All of the night operators in the New York and Chicago offices quit.

Several of the large brokerage houses yielded to the demands of their operators and averted a strike, in others the men left their keys early in the day.

President Samuel Gompers of the American Federation of Leon, arrived in Chicago Monday and, held a long conference with other labor leaders. He and all the others declared that the federation would support the strikers. Mr. Gompers said:

"As to the merits of the operators strike I know stothing. But the action has had the sanction of their executive committee and national officers and that removes from the scope of the inquiry any investigation into its merits.


