The Bureau of Labor Statistics has played an important part in the changes which have come about. Many of the new methods employed are the result of investigations and information secured through the department. It has been active, too, in securing better things for the meri employed in the industry, and the mining laws for the protection of life and property are either its work or the result of information and statistics collected by the department.

It is now ten years since the present administration of the boreau took held.
