Now Illinois Primary Law.

The new Illinois Primary Law.

The new Illinois Primary law contains the following prevision:

"No person shall be allowed to vote at a primary who shall have signed the petition for nomination of a candidate of any party that he does not affiliate with, when such a candidate is to be voted for as the primary."

"And no person shall be allowed to vote who shall have signed the nominating papers of an independent candidate for any office for which office candidates are to be voted for as said primary, or if he shall have voted at a primary, or another political party within a period of two years next preceding such primary."
