"I hid in a barn when I discovered that Confederates had arrived in town, but I left it when it was peppered by artillery fire and concealed myself at the mouth of an alley," said Linsaber. "While I remained in the alley two of my comrades attempted to dart across the street to another alley with a hope of escaping from town. They got to the middle of the street when Confederate soldiers stationed in the street intersections cracked and they fell in a heap. I was soon found and I was killed."
