But, really, there is nothing wrong with the income tax. The exemption this year is only \$1000 for single men and \$2000 for married men. The exemption for the year 1932 is \$1500 for single men and \$3000 for married men.

The bronze tablet of the American Legion has been added to organize the campaign. A committee consisting of C. P. Patton, R. E. Williams and W. H. Kessler was appointed to investigate the costs and methods of financing the marker. It was at first estimated that it would cost \$250. A member of the committee believes that the cost would be considerably less than that. The plans of the volunteers would be solicited for contributions, and the American Legion, Auxiliary and W.R.O. might be asked to contribute.
