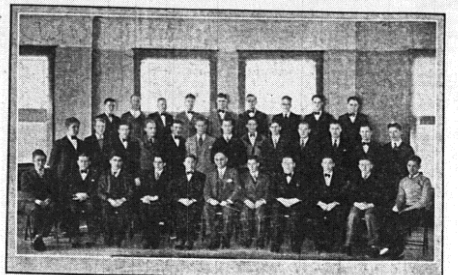

The bill would permit declaration of holidays in the state, in cities, or villages on which the banks would remain closed.

Chain Store Bill Placed in Committee of State Senate

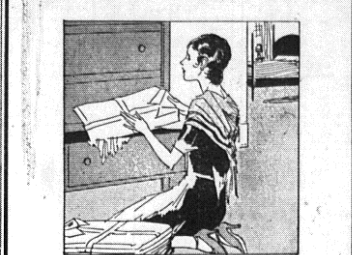
Several hundred proponents of the Gunning chain store tax bill through the senate galleries recently at a hearing on the measure before a committee of the whole. The Gunning bill, patterned after the Indiana chain store tax law, carries a license fee of \$3 annually for one store, and graduates the fee until it reaches \$50 for each store in excess of twenty. Opponents of the bill will be heard before the senate March 1.

Would Force Candidates for Election to Stay in Open

Senators R. V. Graham and George M. Maypole, Chicago, have introduced a series of election bills that will put teeth in election laws. The bills provide for a prison sentence of one to fourteen years for violation of the act relating to false election promises by candidates. They also provide penalties for publication or distribution of anonymous literature relative to candidates, and for falsifying or destroying nomination papers or committing ballot frauds.
