The majority of merchant throughout Illinois will add the sales tax to all articles purchased on Saturday, April 4, and there after until a supreme court ruling is obtained on the constitutionality of the measure.

Monthly Returns A summary of the regulations is as follows: 1. All retailers must make a true and correct report of their gross receipts from sales of goods, wares, and commodities.
