Governor Urges Citizens to Co-operate in Payment of New State Sales Tax

There will be no delay in the arrangements that are being made for the collection of the sales tax, according to Gov. Henry Horner.

"We are going ahead with our preparation for the collection of the tax under the theory that the proceeds in the Madison county circuit court will be disposed of speedily. The attorney-general is planning immediate action and we believe that there will be no delay in the actual collection of the tax."

"Parole officers who do not want to see the city under the state of desecration and hundreds of thousands of its citizens in danger of starvation will prepare for the payment of the tax and go ahead with the plans which are already on foot. They are ready to support the state government and they are assured that by any chance it should be decided that the state is not to collect the tax that cannot be surmounted every day of the year."
