The last program meeting

The last program meeting of the year was held Wednesday, April 5, at the Methodist church. Dr. Edwin D. Frost, director emeritus of Yerkes observatory, talked on "The Splendor of the Heavens..."

Dr. Frost said that the distinctive

feature of the heavens is light and order with stereotyped slides, first showing views of Yerkes observatory, notable for its 40-inch telescope, largest of its kind in the world...

Earth's nearest neighbor

is the moon, one of the smallest of the heavenly bodies, but because it is relatively near to us, it looks to be the largest next to the sun. We know more about it than any of the planets or stars...

The constellation of Orion

is one of the brightest in the northern sky. The three bright stars across the center are called Rigel, Saiph and Betelgeuse...

The Milky way or galaxy

is a vast system of stars and planets. It takes over four years for light to reach us from the nearest star, Alpha Centauri, which is 43 light years away...

The great cluster of stars

in the constellation of Orion is a globular mass of stars, 2 million in number, and 30 or 40 thousand light years away...

In closing Dr. Frost said that

the trilling atmosphere of the evening was a most enjoyable one. The program was a most successful one and the audience was very large...
