"GENERAL of the ARMIES"



Gen. John J. Pershing Born in LINN COUNTY, MO. Sept. 12, 1860

an office created by Congress following the World War which was given to the man who was recognized as the greatest of our soldiers during the World War

PERSHING GRADUATED FROM WEST POINT, 1886, and in 1891 he was appointed captain of the 25th Infantry. He was promoted to major in 1894, lieutenant colonel in 1897, colonel in 1900, and major general in 1903. He was promoted to lieutenant general in 1906, and to full general in 1917. He was appointed commander-in-chief of the American forces in the World War, 1917-1919. He retired Sept. 9, 1924.

Gen. Pershing has been honored and decorated by most all the civilized countries of the world.

LEGAL

THE CITY OF BARRINGTON, ILL. HAS ADOPTED THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE NO. 189:

SECTION 1. No person, firm or corporation, controlling, driving or operating any motor vehicle of a type commonly known as a pleasure car, shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand or be parked for a period of longer than one hour on the days between 7 o'clock a. m. and 6 o'clock p. m. on any streets or highways on any of the streets herein designated and no person, firm or corporation shall cause or permit any truck propelled either by animals or other power to be parked or stand on any streets hereinafter designated for a period of longer than one hour for the purpose of loading or unloading such truck, the said streets or portion of streets referred to in this section are:

Section 1. Street—between Hough Street and Park Avenue; Hough Street—between Station Street and Apple Street; Cook Street—between a point 100 feet south of Station Street to Park Avenue; Park Avenue—between Main Street to Chestnut Street; Chestnut Street—between Grove Avenue to Main Street; Railroad Street—between a point 100 feet west of Cook Street to Main Street.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate or fail to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$25.00 for each offense.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and due publication on this day of July, 1933. Passed this 10th day of July, 1933. Attest: ELDEN GIESKE, Village President. A. C. BIRNBAUM, Village Clerk.
