AN EXPENSIVE LESSON

The future of government-in-business is not so bright as it seemed awhile ago.

The people have discovered something. They have found that the only way their community can build, for example, a power plant, is to float a bond issue. They have found that this requires vast sums of additional tax money—laid on top of already onerous taxes.

When people are learning by dear experience that when government goes into business in competition with its citizens, they have lost, not gained—that such service furnished them "at cost," means generally "at cost" to their own pocket-books.

The "avalanche" of codes of fair competition in industry recently promulgated by Gen. Hugh S. Johnson, administrator of the national industrial recovery act, has begun to descend upon the administration, but the government nevertheless is moving toward the formulation of a sweeping schedule fixing maximum and minimum wages and production for all industries to adopt voluntarily pending the submission and final approval of trade agreements.

PARKING ORDINANCE

The one hour parking ordinance, now in effect, may serve several good purposes, but we believe it is ill thought in at least one respect.

Rural residents who work in Chicago are in the habit of parking their cars within a convenient distance of the depot during the day while they are in Chicago. The convenience of so doing seems to be a privilege the village ought not to withhold.

We have respect for the judgment of the present village trustees. No doubt there was some condition of crowded traffic resulting from abuse of the parking privileges. But we wonder if the police will penalize customers of the railroad and of local stores, who are also friends of the village of Barrington, in too broad an application of the revised ordinance which was meant primarily to curb parking hogs.
