Our Patriotic and Economic Duty TO PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT'S PLAN As We See It

THE food and grocery distributors, because of the many conditions within the trade, one of which is the handling of large quantities of perishable farm products, were given a Code by the Administrator containing 48 hours as maximum working hours of employment. The purpose of the National Industrial Recovery Act is to employ people at a living wage which automatically brings about greater purchasing power so that producers, mills, factories and commercial organizations will have more business as a result of this added employment and increased purchasing power. Grocery store hours during normal times have averaged 7 1/2 hours weekly, and to reduce these hours to any great extent and bring them closer to maximum labor hours would defeat plans and aims the N. R. A. wishes to accomplish. It, therefore, becomes the economic and patriotic duty of grocery stores to remain open reasonable hours per week so that added employment becomes necessary. Our own thought on grocery store hours is as follows: MONDAY to FRIDAY 8:00 A. M. to 6:00 P. M., and SATURDAY 8:00 A. M. to 9:00 P. M., which is a total of 6 1/2 hours per week, which is most reasonable and practical in grocery stores and which will aid in the accomplishments desired in the N. R. A.
