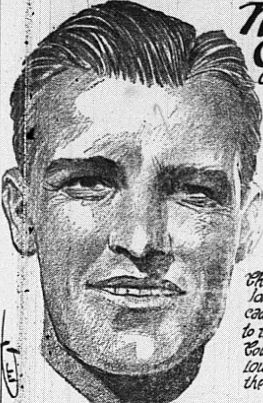

97 Year Old Ex-Governor
Once Saved by Sherman

"Private Joe" Pifer who became governor of Illinois and who appointed the state commission to the World's Columbian Exposition in 1892 is coming to A Century of Progress, the Chicago World's Fair on Illinois Day, Friday, August 11. This was announced today when former state senator Florence Pifer Bohrer informed Lieutenant-Governor Thomas F. Donovan, chairman of the day, that his father, former Governor Joseph W. Pifer, still hale and hearty at 97 in his Bloomington home, would be able to join the more than six living ex-governors and Governor Horner as guest guests on the state's "big day."

Probably a few of the present generation know how General Sherman saved the life of the common soldier who was later to become governor of Illinois. Governor Pifer told of the incident. During the terrific fighting before Jackson in the latter days of July, 1863, Private Pifer was badly wounded. Medical corps officers said that if he could be obtained he and some other injured men might survive. But the nearest ice was in Vicksburg, fifty miles away. Pifer's older brother, a young officer, asked his division commander to send for the ice but was told that no soldiers could be spared for the trip. In desperation, the brother burst in General Sherman's headquarters and told the red-headed commander of the situation. Sherman immediately wrote Bohrer, r. c. 3 1 2
