Trista sell spectacles, or eyeglasses, they are consuming sales of tangible personal property at retail, and therefore, are liable for the tax on the gross receipts of such sales.

Sellers of ice to butchers, grocery stores, delicatessens, restaurants, soft drink parlors and similar establishments for use in refrigeration, and not for resale, are liable for tax on such sales.

Sellers of tangible personal property must determine when sales are made whether the buyer purchases the goods for use or consumption or for purposes of resale. The burden of proof is upon the seller that a sale of tangible personal property was not made at retail. Who in doubt the seller should take for his protection a certificate from the buyer.

Sales of labels or name plates to a manufacturer who affixes them to products manufactured by him constitute sales for resale, if such labels or name plates are an integral and necessary part of the product sold.

Sales to the federal government, or sales by the federal government, do not come within the scope of the Illinois retailer's tax.

Charges for alterations, when such charges are not part of the selling price of tangible personal property sold at retail, are taxable.

Sellers of coal to persons who use it for domestic and heating purposes are liable for the payment of taxes upon their gross receipts. Whether ashes or cinders produced incident to the burning of the coal are sold, does not relieve the seller from responsibility for the payment of the tax.
