She suggested that Christian women help prevent war by observing the following: to learn the history of the international danger spots; think things through; think independently; teach children the beauty of hygiene, peace and the thrill of the drum and bugle; observe a day of prayer and sacrifice in any way to prevent war. The speaker closed with this statement: "When people become Christians their heart there will be no wars."

State Treasurer's Office Limited, Martin Says

A great deal of trouble and delays are being caused over the state by parties sending to the state treasurer, John S. Martin, documents and other things that should be sent to other departments, and in order that the people of the state may know those things coming under the jurisdiction of the state treasurer, Mr. Martin has prepared a list of the things which his office operates: The treasurer is custodian of the funds of the state, and is in payment of bills, except those contracted by the treasurer's office or by specific legislation to the laws of the state under the inheritance tax law, the corporation law, workman's compensation law and local bond funds. All other bills are vouchers in the respective offices or departments contracting the bills, and upon approval of the officer or the director of finance in the case of code departments, are presented to the auditor whose warrant is issued, countersigned by the treasurer, and then delivered or mailed by the auditor to the person or corporation whose bill has thus been approved and authorized. These warrants are similar in form to bank drafts or checks, and may be negotiated or transferred by promissory endorsement in the same manner as a check, until presented at the office of the state treasurer for payment.
