**Tread Girls of Papa**  
The marriage customs of the Korlai tribes inhabiting the coast regions of New Guinea, near Port Moresby, are peculiar in that young girls from the age of six are confined in cages which they cannot leave until the day they are married. They are guarded by old women and have their eyes only once a day to make their ablutions. The cages are placed within the houses perched up in tall trees for safety. The houses are called "dohos" and contain a goodly supply of rocks for digestive purposes.

**Premier Wood Destroyer**  
The termite is the world's premier wood destroyer. The damage it does to wooden buildings in the United States alone is estimated at around \$100,000,000 a year. No other insect or animal approaches it in damage to wooden property. Almost every sort of wood is attacked by it. Some woods are more or less resistant, but the only two termite-proof woods known are the baobab of India and the poisonous manzanita of the Virgin Islands. The annual damage to wooden buildings in termite-infested areas is estimated at 1 per cent every year.

**Angora and Persian Cats**  
of Same Family in U. S.  
Long-haired cats have enjoyed a substantial market in France for more than 200 years and in England for more than 100 years, observes a writer. Until within the last 75 years they were known to most English-speaking people as French cats because of their popularity in France.

Firmly implanted in the popular mind are the beliefs that long-haired cats are Angoras and invariably deaf, that all other long-haired cats are Persians, and that a cat's intelligence is related to the length of its hair.

All these ideas are quite erroneous. In the last 100 years the physical characteristics of long-haired cats have materially changed under the influence of selective breeding in the direction of certain lines. In English-speaking countries Angoras and Persians are no longer distinguished; in Germany and France some effort is made to keep them separated. The differences, however, have no reference to color but deal with type of fur, shape of head, size of ears and similar details.

In the United States and England all are grouped together technically as Persians, although Angoras would be just as fitting. They occur in white, black and solid colors, and also in color mixtures.

**Arkansas Is Ar-Kan-Saw.**  
Official Pronunciation  
The correct pronunciation of the name of the river, the state and also the city of Arkansas is ar-kan-saw, with accents on the first and third syllables. In the original bill passed by congress in 1918 and creating the territory, it was called the Territory of Arkansas, the name being derived from the Arkansas Indians. For many years the pronunciation of the state name was a matter of controversy. Between 1844 and 1858 Arkansas was known as Chester Ashley and Andrew H. Sevier. Ashley, a New Englander by birth, always pronounced it Ar-kan-saw, while Sevier, a southerner, pronounced it ar-kan-saw.

In the senate the Vice President recognized Ashley as the senator from Arkansas and Sevier as the senator from Arkansas. In 1881 the state general assembly appointed a committee to examine the question and as the result of their report, the pronunciation Arkansas was made official. The pronunciation of the name of Arkansas City, Arkansas, however, has remained as spelled, Ar-kan-saw.
