CHOCOLATE SOUFFLE

8 tablespoons butter.
3 tablespoons flour.
1 1/2 cups milk.
2 squares chocolate.
1/2 cup sugar.
3 tablespoons hot water.
4 eggs.

Melt butter. Add flour. Add milk gradually while stirring. Cook until it boils. Melt chocolate over water, add sugar and water and stir until smooth. Combine mixture and well-beaten egg yolks. Cool. Fold in beaten whites and vanilla. Bake in buttered dish in pan of water at 400° for 35 minutes. Serve with whipped cream.

Are you worrying about ways to use left-over ham this week-end? One family favorite is creamed macaroni made as follows:

1 pkg. macaroni, cooked in boiling, salted water.
2 cups ham cut in 2 inch squares.
1 green pepper, diced.
2 cups cream sauce.
8 tablespoons grated cheese.

Combine ingredients, topping with well-buttered cracker crumbs. Bake in oven in well-buttered casserole one-half hour. Garnish with parsley.

A "roasted" salad, including tomatoes, radishes, onions, cucumbers, lettuce and French dressing makes a palatable accompaniment.
