To Confirm Four at St. Matthew Church

Confirmation services will be held for four members of St. Matthew Lutheran church Sunday at 10:30 a. m. Reverend E. T. Kretzmann, announced Tuesday. Bernice Luebscher, Otto Malke, Lorraine Jahnke and Hobart Hayes are the members of the class.

The service will begin with the processional, "Take My Life and Let It Be Consecrated Lord to Thee," sung by the class as it marches into the church. The organ prelude will be by Miss Gwendolyn Wolff. The St. Matthew choir, under the direction of Miss Wolff, will sing "I Will Lift Up Mine Eyes Unto the Hills."
