

Bronchos Dropped From Regional Tournament by Maine 26 to 24

Dundee Five Wins Meet by Defeating Elgin in Finals

The Dundee community high school came out on top in the regional tournament at Woodstock last week-end by defeating Crystal Lake, 59 to 32, Maine, 36 to 25, and finally Elgin by the close score of 32 to 31. Dundee beat Elgin on a field goal with five seconds remaining of play.

In the first round Thursday evening the Barrington Bronchos failed to halt a rally and dropped a contest to Maine township high school of Des Plaines. Neither team did much scoring in the first half and the score at the halfway mark was 9 to 8 in favor of Maine. Dismiss Complaint Against Young Man Held for Assault

Hand Held for Assault

A complaint as assault with intent to commit murder and larceny filed against Frank Nanak of Chicago in connection with the disappearance of \$75, two revolvers, a wrist watch and a car from the Tony Hand cottage at Fox River Grove a short time ago, was dismissed by Judge Charles F. Hayes at Woodstock last Thursday following a hearing on the complaint. Hand is Nanak's uncle.

The complaint was filed by Joseph Pfeiffer, caretaker at the Hand cottage. On the witness stand, Nanak told of taking the car in question and going to Chicago, but stated that he did so after he had been assaulted by Hand in the Hand tavern in Algonquin. He said after the fight Hand and Pfeiffer took him from the tavern to the Hand cottage where he was in an unconscious condition for some time. Medical treatment was refused him, he alleged, and when

He revived sufficiently, he took the car and drove to Chicago for treatment.

Nanak denied firing any shots at Pfeiffer as charged in the complaint and also of taking \$75 from the Hand cottage. He did take the revolvers as a protection against another assault, he admitted. Due to the conflict of the parties' stories, State's Attorney William M. Carroll of McHenry county and Judge Hayes came to the conclusion that the situation was a family matter and dismissed the complaint against Nanak and also quashed the warrant. Nanak, who had been held in the county jail under \$10,000 bond, was released following the hearing.
