

Barrington Bronchos Defeat Arlington Cagers in Conference Opener

Palatine Teams Will Come Here Friday Evening

Ponies Drop Close Contest by Score of 20 to 15 at Heights Friday

In one of the most exciting and thrilling games that basketball fans will see for a long time, the Barrington Bronchos defeated the Arlington Heights five, 19-17, at Arlington Friday night. Going up against one of the strongest teams of their conference, the Bronchos fought hard every minute of the game and could not let up at any time. The game was close until the final gun, the crowd going wild with excitement in the closing minutes of the game. Dick Watson was high point man, scoring 9 points to lead the Bronchos to victory.

The first quarter ended in a 4-4 tie and the half finished in an 11 to 11 deadlock.

In the beginning of the third quarter, the Bronchos were helped by the fact that Milligan, big center of the Heights team had to leave the game on fouls. They went into the last quarter leading 18 to 15. This lead was never overcome, but the Barrington boys had to maintain an airtight defense to keep their opponents from scoring.

As a result of the great defensive efforts of both teams in the last quarter, only five points were scored in this period.

Winning the game leaves Barrington undefeated as far as conference competition goes, so the team is looking forward anxiously to the game with Palatine, victors over Elia last week, next Friday at Barrington.
