Receiving Bids for Ben Franklin Store Fire Damage Work

Bids were being received this week for remodeling the Ben Franklin store, 133 Park avenue, which was gutted by fire last Wednesday morning. Contracts for the work have not been awarded.

According to P. A. Connolly, store owner, the place will be completely remodeled and new fixtures and merchandise installed. The damage loss to the building and merchandise was placed at \$11,000. E. C. Groff owns the building.

Damaged merchandise and debris is being removed, making ready for the actual construction. A new floor will be needed as well as new wall fixtures. It was estimated the business will be in operation in about a month.

Hemorrhages Fatal to Lake Zurich Man

Frank Warner, 36 years old, was seized with pulmonary hemorrhages and died shortly afterwards at his residence in Lake Zurich early Sunday morning. The cause of death was determined at an inquiry conducted by Dr. John L. Taylor, Lake county coroner, Sunday.

Mr. and Mrs. Warner, who have resided at Lake Zurich for the last three years, had been out visiting earlier in the evening and shortly after their return he was fatally stricken. He had been receiving medical treatments for heart trouble, it was learned.

An ambulance was called from Barrington but his condition was too serious to permit his removal. The body was taken to Chicago for burial Wednesday.

Mr. Warner, who was treasurer of Cenol Products Co., was born in Bromberg, Germany, and is survived by his widow, Adah, and two brothers.
