# MEETING OF PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

### April 28, 1975

A regularly scheduled meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 7:30 P.M. on April 28, 1975 at Country side School in the Village of Barrington Hills.

Meeting was called to order by President McLaughlin. Roll

Minutes of the March 24th meeting were presented for approval. Motion made and seconded. Minutes were approved.

Minutes of the Special meeting of Arpil 7th were presented to the Board for approval. Motion made and seconded to approve. Motion carried.

Minutes of the Special meeting of April 12th were presented to the Board for approval. Motion was made and seconded to approve as corrected. Motion carried.

The results of the canvass of election returns of the April 15 election were read by the Clerk. 647 votes were cast. John Butler - 519, James Kempe 537, Louis Klein 521, Dr. E. L. Malters 142, and Dorothy Hallett 109.

Mr. Mc-aughlin commended Pete Grigsby for his many years of service to the Village and wished his success in the future.

At this time Mrs. Blanchard swore in the newly elected Trustees.

Mr. Mac-aughlin re appointed Martin Cussell, Chaymanand Stern Stown Kerner to the Plan Commission and appointed Mary Jo Garre to the Plan Com-

mission. Mrs. Garre was then sworn in by Mrs. Blanchard.

Regular order of business was resumed with the Treasurer's Report from Miss Olsen. She noted investing \$\Phi\$ 10,000 in Treasury Bills, which expire in August. A motion was made and seconded approving the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

Sears Hallett asked to be recognized and reported that Cook County had made and error in distributing funds and had not put the school district on the computer. He said that apparently the money had been distributed to the Villages in the district. Legal steps were being taken to correct the error.

Mr. Kempe made a motion to transfer \$ 3,625.00in revenue sharing funds to Account # 604, Salaries of Police Officers. Motion was seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried.

Finance: Mr. Kempe presented the unpaid bills to the Board for approval as follows:

A motion was made and seconded approving the bills. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. McLaughlin appointed Mr. Kempe to co-sign checks to replace Mr. Grigsby. He will be bonded out.

Mr. Kempe stated that he will have the preliminary budget ready for the May meeting.

At this time a resolution to transfer funds within various accounts was presented to the Board. (copy attached) A motion was made and seconded to approve the resolution. Resolution approved.

Results of the April 15th Special Plection to increase the tax rate to .40% from .15% for Police Protection were read. The proposal passed, 417 to 207, 647 votes cast and 23 spoiled ballots. Clerk will notify all four counties of the results.

Ordinance 75-5 requiring filing of certificate of occupancy when building is completed was presented to the Board. Motion to approve, seconded. Discussion. Mr. Craig explained it was so that the property is put on the tax rolls at the time of occupancy instead of waiting until the end of the year. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Ordinance was adopted.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Butler reported that the 10 ton limit is still in effect on the Village maintained roads.

The townships of Barrington and Cuba have notified us that they won't be plowing our roads next winter. It could mean a 50% increase in expenses for the Village.

Mr. MacArthur asked if there was an agricultural exemption for the 10 ton weight limits. Clarification will be checked out.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. MacArthur read a letter thanking our Police for assisting the Barrington Police Department in response to a call.

Mr. MacArthur reported 112 routine calls and investigations, 160 motor vehicle citations and 1 burglary (open to date) for the month of April. There have 1250 stickers sold to date. He stated that the villagers are on notice that more aggressive enforcement of the sticker ordinance will be in effect immediately.

ZONING AND PLANNING: In Mrs. Hansen's absence Mr. McLaughlin reported that the Zoning Board of Appeals had approved Mr. SanFillipo's request for a Special Use and referred it to the Board of Trustees. Ordinance 75-6 granting a special use was presented to the Board. Motion made and seconded to approve. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Ordinance was adopted.

A letter of recommendations for the DMD subdivison from Wight Engineers was referred to the Plan Commission.

Mr. Craig noted that Village application for participation in the flood plain insurance program had been accedpted, effective April 3, 1975. Villagers may purchase insurance at reduced rates thru their own agents. Information may be obtained from State Farm Insurance 2309 Oak Ave, Bloomington, Ill.

Cook County Toard is holding hearings for new zoning ordinances for unincorporated areas of Cook Tounty.

Mr. McLaughlin opered the discussion on the sewerage treatment plant study. BACOG is applying for a study grant to be the study unit for the area. Mr. Mc.aughlin said they are asking for our support. If BACOG isn't granted the study, it is possible that it will be given to NIPCI. After discussing the matter, at which time Mr. MacArthur expressed concern as to whether or not our interests would be best served, Mr. McLaughlin said he would sign the request, in as much as it really didn't require Board action.

Mr. McLaughlin read a letter from the Village of Barrington notifying us that Mr. Loebbak was no longer with the Building department. Mr. MacArthur questioned the circumstances and said that he felt we were owed an explanation. Mr.  $M_{\mbox{c}}$ -aughlin will ask Mr. Mabien what transpired.

ADMINISTRATION: Mr. Denton is looking into lighting for the parking area at the new Village Hall. He is also consulting with the State as to traffic control at the intersection at the Village Hall.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig reported that a petition of intervention had been filed with the Commerce Commission in regard to the petition filed by the Natural Gas Pipeline Company.

An amended compalint has been filed in the Merten's case and Mr. Craig put everyone on notice that they could expect a summons.

Mr. McLaughlin declared May 1, 1975 Law Day in our Village.

Mr. MacArthur expressed his thanks to the Countryside Association for their support of the Police Tax referendum.

Mr. Tim Lee, owner of the Tralee Farm Restaraunt appeared requesting approval of a liquor license. Mr. Mc aughlin as Liquor Commissioner said approval would be granted as soon as the necessary inquires had been made and the papers filed with the Village.

There being no further business a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.
