"We have really accomplished a lot," Wauterlek states, "We visited the brand new school building serving 600 orphaned and poverty stricken children in Zambia, we saw farm fields teaming with hope on what would have been considered wastelands, and an expanding network of goats supporting hundreds of poor rural women." The 2008 Garden Faire proceeds have been slated for the completion of a second school building, equipped with books, meals and uniforms, a self-sustaining economic development program in the Western Province of Zambia built around raising livestock and specialized farming, and the building of fresh water wells in the Western Province of Zambia



Illinois Supreme Court Allows Public Employees to Sue for Retaliatory Discharge

The Illinois Supreme Court recently held that a public employer was not immune from a suit for retaliatory discharge. Retaliatory discharge is a state law claim available to an employee who has been terminated as a result of asserting a worker's compensation claim. In that case, an employee sued his park district employer for retaliatory discharge when he was terminated shortly after returning to work from a work-related injury. The park district moved to dismiss the suit on the basis that it was immune from suit under the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (Tort Immunity Act). The Illinois Supreme Court rejected that argument finding that when a public employer discharges an employee in retaliation for filing a workers' compensation claim no immunity protection is allowable. It is unlawful under the Illinois Workers' Compensation Act for any employer to discharge an employee for the exercise of their rights under that Act. As such, the Court held that the immunity applicable to discretionary decisions found under the Tort Immunity Act does not apply to a retaliatory discharge claim when an employee's discharge is based upon filing of a worker's compensation action since no discretion exists that can be lawfully exercised based on that type of discharge. a public employer cannot use the provisions of the Tort Immunity Act which relieves liability to a public employer for certain acts or omissions of its employees because a retaliatory discharge claim can only be brought against an employer and not its agents or employees.




"A Night Under the Big Top" Gala **Raises Funds to Support BYFS Community-Based Programs**

Are You Considering Plastic Surgery?

When considering plastic surgery and whether it is the right choice for you, the first and most important decision is selecting your surgeon. Depending on your need, you should consider a board-certified plastic surgeon for both body and face surgery or experienced facial plastic surgeons with the prerequisite fellowship training in facial plastic surgery.

We all age differently, and visible signs of facial aging occur over time as a result of sun exposure, heredity and lifestyle. Common signs of aging are increased skin laxity with sagging, loss of volume in certain areas and appearance of unwanted wrinkles. Well, what can you do?

Starting with nonsurgical minimally invasive procedures, there are many options on the palette:

Botox® and injectable soft tissue fillers (pharmaceuticals such as Juvéderm™ and Restylane®) are often used in combination to help to smooth out facial lines and soften hard earned wrinkles and skin creases. The effects are gratifying but temporary, lasting usually anywhere from 3 to 6 months. These skin and soft tissue fillers are considered medical procedures and require FDA approval for cosmetic


Sculptra® is relatively new injectable "volumizing" filler administered with a layered approach, requiring initially several sessions of treatments 4 to 6 weeks apart. It stimulates deposition of collagen under the skin with progressive increase in volume that lasts for up to two years or longer. As this effect starts to decline, it can be "touched up" usually with only a single treatment. Sculptra is already FDA approved for therapeutic use for certain disorders and is now seeking FDA approval for cosmetic use. (It is currently being used "off label" by select qualified medical practitioners for cosmetic applications.) These facial rejuvenation procedures do not stop the aging process, but may help turn back the clock.

Tissue augmentation with fillers is a quick, in-office procedure that can produce a marked improvement in restoring facial fullness and a more youthful appearance. Recovery time is short with minimal swelling. When choosing to undergo soft tissue augmentation, keep in mind that plastic surgeons are trained not only in injection therapy, but also in all types of nonsurgical and surgical facial rejuvenation. He or she may know your face better than you.

On the surgical side of the palette, some of the popular options are:

Eyelid surgery is a very rewarding procedure to improve the appearance of the upper or lower eyelids or both. Once healed it gives a rejuvenated appearance and a more rested look. The procedure treats drooping or loose sagging skin of the upper and/or lower eyelid, bags under the eyes and excess skin and fine wrinkles of the lower eyelid. The recovery time is relatively short, and the procedure is done on an outpatient basis.

Facelifts and brow lifts are designed to correct the sagging of tissue of the face and forehead and a deeply furrowed brow. It addresses deep creases below the eyes, along the nose extending to the corner of the mouth, and repositions sagging

facial features. It also addresses loose skin and fatty deposits under the chin. Facelift does not change the fundamental appearance of a person and does not stop the aging process.

Breast enhancement surgeries are performed for cosmetic appearance and well being. These include breast augmentation with saline or gel implants, breast lift with or without implants and breast re-

Abdominoplasty, lower body lift and other body contouring procedures are ideal to address stretched and excess skin that results from childbearing and significant weight loss. These improve shape and complete the weight loss transformation. As more people are undergoing gastric bypass weight loss surgeries, the demand for total body lift, arm lift and thigh lifts are commonplace.

Expected Results

While no one can guarantee that the result of your plastic surgery will look exactly as you envisioned, good communication with your doctor, and a trust between you, your physician and his staff is paramount in conveying what is possible. Keep in mind that while plastic surgery has dramatic benefits, it may not be for everyone. Think about what you want to achieve, your expectation and desired outcome. Healthy Pregnancy

Many women become more interested in their health once they find out that they are pregnant. However, the foundation for a healthy pregnancy begins before conception. All women, who are thinking about becoming pregnant, should see their health care provider to gain some insights into nutrition, vitamin supplements, exercise and laboratory testing, which can ensure a successful pregnancy.

Women who are planning pregnancy and who are pregnant should choose a well-balanced diet to get the essential nutrients they need each day. Women need several servings of protein-rich foods (meats, poultry, fish and eggs), grains, calcium-rich foods, vegetables and fruits per day. Women also need adequate fluid intake; eight or more 8-ounce servings per day. Women who are vegetarian may need to take additional supplements. The recommended weight gain in pregnancy is normally between 25 to 35 pounds. Women who are underweight may need to gain a little more and women, who are overweight, should limit weight gain to 15 to 20 pounds.

Women often have questions concerning the safety of certain foods in pregnancy. Caffeine can be consumed in moderation, as studies have not shown that it causes birth defects. Artificial sweeteners, such as aspartame and Splenda, are also acceptable. Certain fish, such as swordfish, should be avoided because of high mercury levels

A prenatal vitamin, which contains folic acid, is essential to a healthy pregnancy. Many studies have shown that folic acid reduces the risk of a baby developing a type of birth defect called a neural tube

Unhealthy behaviors, such as smoking,



alcohol or drug use, should ideally be addressed before conception. Pregnant women are advised to avoid alcohol because this has been linked to learning disabilities and birth defects in babies. Smoking can lead to poor fetal growth, preterm birth and sudden infant death

Most women can continue to exercise in pregnancy. In fact, this may benefit the health of both the mother and the fetus. Women who maintain a fitness program have decreased weight gain and fat deposition during pregnancy and an improved sense of well-being. They may also have a shorter, less complicated birth and a more rapid recovery after the birth. Recommended forms of exercise in pregnancy include walking, cycling, swimming and yoga. It is safe to exercise several times per week at a comfortable intensity. Women with complications in their pregnancy, such as bleeding, preterm labor or other medical conditions, should check with their health care provider before embarking upon an exercise program.

Pregnancy can be a wonderful time for women to boost their overall health. A well-balanced diet, vitamin supplements and exercise are all components to a successful pregnancy.

Cosmetic Dentistry: What Are Lumineers and da Vinci Veneers?

The recent surge in interest for cosmetic dentistry has prompted dental manufacturers to capitalize on its popularity. Patients are showing up in dental offices around the country with information on cosmetic procedures that they get from the Internet, TV or magazines. Two of the major marketers are Lumineers and da Vinci Ve-

Lumineers are porcelain veneers that are made from porcelain produced by the Cerinate Company. Their marketing suggests that their veneers are so thin, no tooth structure needs to be removed. The patient can visit their dentist and with just a simple impression, a full set of veneers can be fabricated and bonded directly to the unprepared teeth. While this sounds like a great concept, there are very few people that are actually good candidates for this type of procedure. The patient would have to have large spaces between their front teeth and their teeth would have to have a "peg" appearance to them. Trying to put Lumineers on normally shaped teeth that have normal contacts between them will make the teeth feel bulkier and will not allow for reshaping and coloring in the areas where the teeth touch one another. The added bulk can also violate the zone that the teeth are meant to be maintained in. If bulk is added to the front of the teeth, the lip will start pushing the teeth back into the zone. This can create bite problems which can eventually lead into TMJ problems. This is especially true for patients with thin up-

While Cerinate is an excellent company, they are not the only ones that produce porcelain for veneers. The others also make "contact-lens-thin" veneers. The major concern for the patient should not be the type of porcelain but rather the laboratory that fabricates the veneers. The artistry involved in making a lifelike veneer is extensive. Asking for a specific brand of porcelain will not guarantee a natural and lifelike appearance. If that were true, then all of the artists that




bought their painting supplies from the same place that Picasso did, would be world famous.

The term "da Vinci Veneers" was popularized by Dr. Bill Dorfman. When he did makeovers on ABC, he would describe the porcelain veneers as being "da Vinci Veneers." da Vinci was not a type of veneer but was actually the name of the dental laboratory that was fabricating the veneers for Dr. Dorfman. The da Vinci Dental Studio is based out of California and has been providing excellent work for years. To capitalize on the popularity, a marketing group was formed that uses the da Vinci name. A dentist can visit their Web site at www.davinciveneers.com and sign up in the area that is marked "For Professionals." For \$950 a month, the da Vinci Group will provide him with marketing material, patient referrals and a list of about 40 different dental labs around the country that are now part of the program. da Vinci will also help the dentist provide financing for the patient's cosmetic den-
