# Benin Kings and Rituals: Court Arts from Nigeria

This summer, the Art Institute of Chicago will host a landmark exhibition: Benin Kings and Rituals: Court Arts from Nigeria. Spectacular and sophisticated, the royal brass and ivory sculptures from the Benin kingdom in south-central Nigeria are among the most coveted icons of African art. Yet, despite widespread recognition of its artistic legacy, the kingdom has never been the focus of a large-scale and comprehensive exhibition. That is about to change when approximately 220 of the greatest works from Benin will be featured at the Art Institute—the exclusive North American stop for this truly outstanding

Members of the Barrington/Northwest Community Associates (B/NWCA) will have the opportunity to view this exceptional presentation on Thursday, Sept. 18, when they travel to the Art Institute for a lecture from Jeff Nigro and a self-guided tour of the exhibit. Nigro, director of adult programs in the Department of Museum Education, will preview the collection, illuminating Benin's royal history by analyzing a selection of artifacts from the exhibit. The concept of "oba" or divine king is prominent in Benin's history and examples such as bronze figures, altar heads, wall plaques, staffs of office, and royal regalia support the prominence of kingship, hierarchy and court ritual. They also reflect Benin's growing wealth during the 16th and 17th centuries from expanded coastal trading. Finally, the exhibition traces the reconfiguration of Benin's monarchy after the invasion by British forces in 1897 and the impact of that event on its artistic treasures.

Following this insightful discussion, members will have time to explore the exhibition in a self-guided tour.

#### **United States Supreme Court Decides Age Discrimination Case** by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

The Age Discrimination in Employment Act (ADEA) protects individuals who are 40 years of age or older from employment discrimination based on age. The ADEA's protections apply to both employees and job applicants. Under the ADEA, it is unlawful to discriminate against a person because of his/her age with respect to any term, condition, or privilege of employment-including, but not limited to, hiring, firing, promotion, layoff, compensation, benefits, job assignments, and training. It is also unlawful to retaliate against an individual for opposing employment practices that discriminate based on age.



Recently the United States Supreme Court ruled that when a company asserts layoffs of older workers were based on factors other than the workers' age, the


company has the burden of proving those factors are valid. By its decision, the Supreme Court enhanced the ability of older workers to bring job discrimination claims. The decision is significant since it comes as the nation's work force is aging and many companies are downsizing and laying off workers. In that case, the Plaintiff and other employees sued the employer after being laid off allegedly due to budget cuts. The Plaintiff claimed that the determinations of which employees were let go had a disparate impact on older workers since 30 of the 31 employees laid off were over 40 years old. The Court held that an employer must prove the reason-



# New Illinois Children's **Eye Examination Law**

Effective Jan. 1, 2008, the new Illinois Children's Eye Examination Law requires that all children, grades kindergarten and up, have an eye examination performed by a trained eye care professional, and submit a copy to the school no later than Oct. 15. This examination must be performed by a licensed optometrist or opthalmalogist; a screening performed at school by a nurse or even by a pediatrician is considered insufficient for meeting the requirements of the new law. The goals of this law are to maximize children's learning potential and behavioral development, and to establish a foundation for early intervention and treatment of eye diseases amongst children and adolescents.

These goals are based on extensive studies conducted by the Illinois Optometric Association, which found that 80 percent of a child's learning occurs visually, that one out of every four children have some type of visual disorder, and that more than 50 percent of students who are considered problem learners are living with some type of undetected visual problem. These facts demonstrate how closely interrelated vision and learning are among children. Therefore, by ensuring the early treatment of visual impairment, the state hopes to increase the success of learning within the classroom, decrease learning set backs-which could significantly affect your child's future, and increase the overall health of children's eyes.



Thirteen American White horses (think Lone Ranger and his faithful mount, "Hi Ho Silver, Away!") in Monmouth, Ill., were at real risk of severe neglect, having been all but abandoned by their owner, whose health issues interfered with the necessities of horse care. white horses-among them stallions, mares and fillies-were at the HARPS farm in Barrington. The costs of deworming, vaccinating, gelding, and training the white horses, most of which had been minimally handled, took a further toll on the HARPS coffers, as did the numerous smaller but equally important rescue efforts, one of which resulted in the addition of two formerly neglected burros to the HARPS menagerie.

The HARPS 2008 Fundraiser provided much-needed financial support to further its commitment to the humane treatment of our hooved friends. That Donna Ewing and HARPS are grateful to their donors is an understatement. As Ronda Ewing said, "There are no words to express how profoundly thankful we are.'

Have you ever seen someone with a cap or crown on their front tooth and could tell from a mile away that it doesn't match their other teeth?
