Local Charity Combats African AIDS... One Village at a Time

Hands of Hope announces plans to raise funds for the African village of Ruhengeri in Rwanda. The charity is a community of women in the Northwest Suburbs of Chicago who work to help women and children worldwide. Its volunteers research life-threatening issues, select a project, raise public awareness and host fundraisers to provide financial support. Recently, Hands of Hope representatives returned from a two-week tour of Malawi, Rwanda and Kenya where they witnessed the devastating impact of AIDS.

To date, AIDS has claimed the lives of over 17 million Africans and leaving over 12 million orphans. And many of those orphans are also afflicted with AIDS. An estimated 26 million people on the continent are infected with HIV. But numbers do not tell the human story. "Millions of African adults are dying, leaving behind children who are grieving and struggling to survive without a parent's care," says Wauterlek, founder of Hands of Hope. "Many of those dying have infected partners who need care themselves.'

What can be done to confront AIDS, one of the greatest socioeconomic and health crises in history? "Hands of Hope decided to break down the problem to a manageable size, so we chose to focus on Ruhengeri, a poor area in Rwanda with 800,000 people," explains Wauterlek. Rwanda's distress is compounded by the 1994 genocide that claimed the lives of nearly one million people. This destroyed the economy and plunged the peopleespecially women—into even deeper poverty. The group hopes that this model of one community reaching out across the globe to another will encourage other communities to do the same.

Specifically, Hands of Hope will provide funds for AIDS resources to help educate people about the cause and effect of the disease. "This is a critical step for positive long-term change," says Wauterlek. "We'll also fund loans for village women to start or expand small businesses." These micro-enterprise development banks are a proven approach, empowering impoverished people to become self-sufficient and regain their hope and dignity. "During our trip, we met women whose loans enabled them to start selling goods like secondhand clothes, vegetables and sugar. They could take care of their families and put nutritious food on the table. Some even earned enough to have a home of

Last year, the Country Garden Faire raised money for Nigerian women afflicted with a gynecological condition resulting from early childhood marriages and subsequent pregnancies. Funds were donated to the ECWA Evangel Hospital in Jos, Nigeria, where a 50-bed surgical rehabilitation center was constructed.

Ticket price is \$15 per person in advance or \$18 at the door for the Country Garden Faire. sticking to the grease. Next, the diamonds are sorted for size and quality.

At this point, the rough diamonds are sold in parcels or mixed packages, with the purchaser of these parcels having no bargaining abilities on its contents. You take the parcel or leave it.

Again the diamonds are sorted and the diamond house now will begin the process of bringing the dull and lifeless rough diamond to its own brilliant future.

A diamond cutter is an apprentice for approximately 10 years. It is a profession that requires a great deal of concentration, scientific knowledge and artistry. The diamond goes through several processes of diamond cutting. The first step is cleaving. Cleaving is the initial "splitting" of the rough diamond if it is determined the shape is not sufficient. Tracing on the stone with ink, indicating where the stone will be split, a small "v" shaped nick is made in the rough. Finally, a blunt blade is put in the nick and a sharp blow with a mallet or steel hammer is given, thus dividing the stone. This operation is usually followed by many hours of study, often days, before continuing with the process.

After the cleaving, the diamond is now put through the process of bruting. Bruting is the fundamental process of shaping the diamond. Next, the grinding begins, which is the sequence for establishing the facets. When the faceting is complete, the original rough diamond has lost a significant amount of carat weight. 

Work Place Protection for Injury and Illness

As many of you know, if you are injured on the job, you are entitled to protection in this state under the Illinois Worker's Compensation Act. While the Worker's Compensation Act does not apply to off the job injury or illness, a now wellknown federal statute may provide you with protection. Particularly, the Family Medical Leave Act (FMLA) requires covered employers to provide up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave in a 12-month period to "eligible" employees who need the time off as a result of a "serious health condition" which prevents the employee from performing the essential functions of the job, or for the serious condition of a parent, spouse or child of the employee when the employee is needed to care for the family member.

Basically, to be eligible for FMLA leave, the employee must have worked for the employer for at least 12 months, have been employed for at least 1,250 hours during the 12-month period immediately prior to the leave and have been employed at a work site where 50 or more employees are employed by the company within 75 miles of the work site. Under the FMLA, a "serious health condition" is defined as "an illness, injury, impairment or physical or mental condition that involves inpatient care in a hospital, hospice or residential medical care facility, or continuing treatment by a healthcare pro-







Improving Your Skin

Step Three—The final step consists of extracting any blackheads or whiteheads. At this point in the treatment, the extractions are easier because the pores are free of any skin that blocks their way out. Once the extractions are completed, a smoothing moisturizer along with a sunblock is applied.

Following Micropeel treatment, the skin feels refreshed and appears to have a healthy, pink glow.

Microdermabrasion Treatment

Step One-The skin will be cleansed using a medical cleanser and toner. Once the skin is completely dry, step two will begin.

Step Two-This step is the most bennon-abrasive treatment that will leave eficial part of the treatment. 
Ela Fine Arts Show

Tragedy Turned to Hope

Rich left the business world in 1980 and applied his skills first to housing needs of urban residents through a church-related organization in Washington, DC. Following a tragedy in the low-income housing complex there, he turned his attention to "transforming young lives through higher

crack cocaine returned to his family living in one of the apartments and murdered his two children, both of whom were active volunteers in a church ministry that served youngsters. In the weeks that followed, Rich met with neighborhood organizations in Washington to found a scholarship fund as a living memorial to the lost children. Today, that work has become Free The Children Trust. It has active chapters in Washington, DC and Chicago, and plans are underway for opening Free The Children chapters in all six states of the federally designated Midwest Education Region.

Since its founding, Free The Children has awarded \$1.4 million in scholarships (\$8,000 per scholar). This initiative is based at 325 East Main Street, Barrington. IL 60010.

"With this year's awards, we now have 126 children who are able to pursue their life's dream of a college education," says Rich. "Our children are those at-risk, meaning they are mainly raised in singleparent homes where drugs or alcohol are an issue and where the family income is at poverty levels. It may come as a surprise to learn that millions of children outside of major urban areas live in just

One of our requirements is that just as we tutor and mentor our scholars, they must in turn tutor and mentor others if asked."


REMODELING 2001...STORY #6

"Our kitchen isn't that old but it's just not working for us. The island counter is too small and I absolutely hate seeing the side of our big refrigerator from the front hall." These were the thoughts Kathy Civik expressed to **Barrington Kitchen & Bath Studio's** designer Kaye Hathaway at their first meeting. Kathy and her husband Ken built their house overlooking Bangs Lake in Wauconda about 15 years ago. That really set the focal point for the kitchen! The new built-in refrigerator was moved away from the kitchen entry and replaced with glass fronted cabinets. These lighted cabinets provide display space for special china and give visitors an inviting first view of the new kitchen.


The desk area in the original kitchen was much larger than the family needed. Kaye suggested building a walk-in pantry with a curtained glass door to provide storage for bulky items. That left enough room for a smaller desk which was given a furniture look with a carved onlay and special moldings. The island, which had housed the cooktop and a raised seating area, has now become a baking and food prep center. Three specially designed carved posts support the eating bar, which was kept at counter height to provide maximum counter space.



The death and injury rate for children under 4 and over 8 has declined, but the rate for 4- to 8year-olds has risen. Over 500 4- to 8-yearolds are killed each year, and almost 100,000 are injured in automobile acci-

A group of pediatricians were among the groups spearheading a request for a Federal law that would require booster seats for 4- to 8-year-olds or 80 pounds. (One of the members of the panel that morning was a gentleman from Ford Motor Company.) injuries in a crash. The rate of unrestrained children quoted was frightening. Only 7% of the children are in booster seats.

Thanks to Home of the Sparrow Execuproviding an update on HOS progress. She reminded the group that "we take




