Barrington Area Crop Walk, Oct. 21

The 19th annual Barrington Area Crop Walk will be held Sunday, Oct. 21, 2001. Registration will be at Barrington Middle School, Station Campus. This ecumenical walk to fight hunger will be a 10K or "Family/Golden Mile." Last year, we had a record-breaking year with 575 walkers from churches, schools, organizations and caring individuals who brought in \$70,000. Twenty-five percent of the funds raised is used to support CWU Barrington Food Pantry, FISH of Carpentersville, Northern Illinois Food Bank, PIN and Meals with Wheels. This year, Wauconda Island Lake Food Pantry joins the list.

Betty Reed of Barrington United Methodist Church is chairperson for the 2001 walk. Her husband, Dwight, will continue his work as treasurer. In addition to celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary, they have organized the walk with concern for the safety of all and a promise of chili and entertainment when walkers return to the school. They hope to exceed the success of last year's event.

We are honored to have two grand marshals this year-Sister Lorraine Menheer of St. Anne Catholic Community, in honor of her untiring work for the poor, and Konrad Bald of Lutheran Church of the Atonement. Bald will join Sister Menheer in leading the walk. He has put Barrington on the map when it comes to Crop Walks. The second highest fund-raiser for Crop Walk in the country, he alone brought in \$17,000 to fight hunger last year. These two outstanding individuals will show us the way, not only in the Crop Walk but in their dedication to help the poor.

Bob Evans of the Carpentersville Food Pantry states that he sees at least a 10 percent increase in need from last year. This food pantry, under the direction of Mr. Evans and Paul Heideman, who has been helping those in need for 22 years, serves 1,300 people a month.

There are many other local recipients of Crop Walk funds. The Northern Illinois Food Bank ships up to a million pounds of food per month to 220 food banks in 14 counties in northern Illinois. Meals with Wheels is credited with distributing 5.229 meals to 54 individuals. We hear

their meals are great, but in many cases, the company of a visitor is just as important. PIN stands for "people in need." Those who come to churches in an emergency are able to get vouchers for gas, a night of lodging and a meal, thanks to PIN. About \$2,000 in vouchers were given out last year. The CWU Barrington Food Pantry promises that 98 cents out of every dollar goes to help hungry people. They gave out \$3,080 in vouchers last year in addition to the food at the pantry. The Wauconda Island Lake Food Pantry serves about 80 families a month.


Though we live in an apparently affluent area, there are people who lose jobs, have emergencies and suddenly find themselves in need of a helping hand. Crop Walk raises the funds to lend that hand. Seventy-five percent of the funds are used nationally and internationally to provide hope to disaster victims, education in overcoming poverty, wells for clean water and food.

In general, Crop Walk joins people of all denominations to demonstrate that starvation and malnutrition are still commonplace. Children right in our neighborhood and around the world still go to bed hungry. This is preventable with a better distribution of our abundance. Some shocking facts published in the June issue of The Lutheran states there are 800 million hungry people in the world; it would take an estimated \$1.6 billion a year to prevent world hunger; and Americans spend \$24 billion a year in liquor stores. These are large figures. Yet, we know that a little bit goes a long way when it is distributed through Crop Walk. Just \$5 can provide seeds for a harvest of 6,700 lbs. of potatoes in Armenia, or 83 treatments of oral rehydration therapy for those suffering from dehydration, or 25 baby chicks for a family in Bosnia. Just \$5 can buy four Moringa tree seedlings. Moringa tree leaves can be crushed into a powder to cure anemia and malnutrition. And research on this amazing tree continues. So rest assured, your Crop Walk dollars are working hard to eradicate hunger.


Tune in Operathon 2001

will be announced during the broadcast to encourage listeners to phone in their pledges. Barrington chapter has pledged \$2,000.


The 16-hour Operathon is organized and administered by the chapters' executive board of Lyric Opera and the 21 chapters in Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin.

Rare Curtis Photogravures Featured at River Trading Post

In 1899, photographer Edward Sheriff Curtis (1868-1952) participated in the Harriman expedition that removed a Tlingit totem pole on the Alaskan coast and turned it over to the Field Museum in Chicago.

Shortly before the turn of the century, he began his quest to record the last living traditions of North American Indian tribes... an undertaking that took over 30 years and ruined his family, his health and ended in financial disaster for him.

The result of the effort, in which Curtis created thousands of images, was to have been published in a massive 20-volume encyclopedia entitled The North American Indian. It is not known how many of the 500 numbered sets originally planned were actually printed, but it is known that only 272 sets were actually sold at an issue price of \$3,000.

Curtis' work has come under much criticism from scholars for providing some of his subjects with costumes to make them look "authentic." Yet Curtis' work contains a great deal of information that is available nowhere else and that had never been published before.

Today, this photographer's life work is preserved in manuscript departments, museums and library stockrooms. While they may be posed and idealistic, they do represent the call for a better world, a www.rivertradingpost.com.

Severance Agreements—Releasing **Your Legal Rights**

As you may know, a severance agreement is intended by an employer to provide a terminated employee with a specific sum of money and/or benefits in exchange for the release of the employee's legal rights against the company. Although employers are not required by law to offer severance, often employers will offer severance pay in situations of a layoff or downsizing. Under those circumstances, severance is usually defined by a company policy which sets forth the calculation of pay based on the employee's length of service and position with the company. Another reason for the offer of severance is to resolve an employee dispute related to the termination. In some situations, the employer may not offer a severance package. However, depending on the particular situation which led to the termination, an agreement may be negotiated. A severance agreement is beneficial to an employer where it desires to avoid future litigation.

A properly drafted severance agreement is enforceable and therefore should be carefully considered. Before you sign

a severance agreement, it is extremely important to know your legal rights and to understand exactly which rights the company wants you to relinquish by agreeing to terms proposed by the company. Sometimes, terminated individuals are fearful and agree to sign away their legal rights in exchange for inadequate compensation or terms which may restrict future employment. For instance, carefully consider a severance agreement if it includes a "noncompete" agreement or "restrictive covenant" provision. If such provisions are properly drafted, they are enforceable and will legally affect your ability to accept

Art Associates to View Van Gogh and Gauguin: The Studio of the South

On Nov. 1, the Barrington Community Associates of The Art Institute of Chicago will sponsor a bus trip to the institute's groundbreaking exhibition Van Gogh and Gauguin: The Studio of the South. It is the first exhibit to explore the artistic and personal relationship of these two artists, and this is the exhibit's only showing in the United States.

Eleven years in the making, this exhibit of 135 works from 63 public and private collections worldwide includes 107 paintings, 19 works on paper and nine sculptural objects. The core of Van Gogh and Gauguin: The Studio of the South focuses on the intense, nineweek period during which the artists worked and lived together in







Smiles for Success—Orthodontics

The New Field of Esthetic Skin Care by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Through the techniques employed by a licensed esthetician, you can improve and enhance the appearance of your skin. Whether you are trying to maintain your skin after a surgical procedure or just want better looking skin, there is a treatment for you. Based on scientific principles, the treatments are custom designed for your skin's particular needs. Esthetic skin care can reduce the depth of surface lines, help fade abnormal brown spots, smooth rough skin and help clear up acne prone skin. Overall, it can give your skin a more youthful and healthier glow. The treatments are only done by a qualified, licensed esthetician in a physician's office and involve various methods of exfoliation, skin bleaching and rehydration. These treatments, when combined with a daily home care regimen, can give dramatic results.

What is an Esthetician?

A licensed esthetician is someone that has gone through specialized schooling and passed a state licenser exam to allow them to take care of the skin from an esthetic or beauty standpoint. A licensed esthetician has applied their specialized training in a medical setting under the oversight of a physician. This allows the esthetician to perform stronger peels and somewhat more aggressive treatments than could be done elsewhere. A myriad of different procedures can be performed. The particular treatment (or combination of treatments) is chosen in the consultation process and is based on that patient's particular need and skin condition. A partial listing of available options include: different strength peels to treat fine lines and wrinkles, special peels to treat irregular pigment, peels to clear up blemishes,

nutrients to the skin and an advanced exfoliating process called a Micropeel. What is a Skin Peel?

A peel gets its name from the way it works. A solution is applied to the skin surface. The solution is absorbed and it causes the outer layers of skin to "peel" or slough off. The degree of peeling is determined by the strength of the solution causing the peel and the depth to which it is absorbed into the skin. Different solutions also cause different effects on the skin. For example, Kojic acid, a fruit acid used in certain peels, has a stronger bleaching effect than other fruit acids such as Glycolic or Lactic acid. When the skin peels, it stimulates a repair process that actually forms a thin layer of new collagen in the upper layer of the skin. With repeated peels and home treatments as well, this collagen layer gets thicker. The thicker the layer gets, the smoother and tighter the skin appears. Generally the goal of these peels is to go as deep as the skin will tolerate without causing an unsightly recovery for the patient. The patient should be able to undergo a peel and still be presentable in public while it is healing.

What is a Micropeel?

This technique involves a double exfoliation process. The first exfoliation is done manually with a #10 scalpel. It removes a

Orthognathic Surgery is a Valuable Tool in Orthodontic Treatment

Orthodontics alone can correct crowding of teeth and many "bite" problems if the upper and lower jaws are in relatively proper position. However, when a patient's jaw or jaws are positioned incorrectly, there may be a need for orthognathic surgery in conjunction with orthodontic treatment.

Orthognathic surgery is sometimes called "surgical orthodontics" because, just as an orthodontist repositions teeth, an oral and maxillofacial surgeon uses orthognathic surgery to reposition one or both jaws. The objective of orthognathic surgery is the correction of a wide range of minor and major facial and jaw irregularities due to unequal growth of the jaws, injury or birth defects.

People who can potentially benefit from orthognathic surgery are those who have a receded lower jaw, an overdeveloped and protrusive lower jaw, or an open bite. Post surgical benefits may include an enhanced appearance and an improved ability to chew, speak and breathe.


diagnostic procedures, you and your doctors will decide on the proper course of treatment. During treatment, your doctors will work closely together. The orthodontist is responsible for moving the teeth prior to surgery so they will fit together properly after the jaws have been repositioned. After surgery, final orthodontic tooth movement is usually necessary to "fine-tune" your bite. 



Black Cohosh—An Herbal Alternative to Estrogen for Menopause by Carole Childers, C.N., L.N.C., All Ways Healthy

between the ages of 45 and 50, many experience hot flashes, sweating, thinning of the vaginal lining and psychological symptoms such as depression, anxiety and forgetfulness.

Current conventional treatment attempts to replace waning natural hormones with supplements of estrogen with or without synthetic progesterone. Hormone Replacement Therapy can reduce menopausal symptoms and the risk of heart disease and osteoporosis. However, problems such as breast tenderness, water retention, reactivation of uterine bleeding and irregular spotting arise. Since 1956, over 1.5 million menopausal women in Germany have used black cohosh to relieve not only hot flashes but also depression and vaginal atrophy. In 1994, over 6.5 million monthly dosages of black cohosh were utilized in menopausal women in Germany, Scandinavia and Austria.

In one study involving 629 female patients and 131 doctors, black cohosh produced clear improvement in over 80 percent of patients within six to eight weeks, with most patients reporting noticeable improvement within four weeks.

When used within recommended dosages, black cohosh shouldn't have any ill effects. However, because it dilates blood vessels, an overdose can trigger headaches, dizziness and low blood pressure.

And always check with your health care provider before beginning any new treatment, whether it's herbal or over-the-counter.


