

Protecting Your Legal Rights—Stopping Workplace Harassment by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

Federal anti-discrimination statutes, such as Title VII (race, gender, religion or national origin), the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (an employee over 40) and the Americans with Disabilities Act, are created to protect employees from illegal discrimination and harassment.

Harassment is generally defined as unwelcome conduct which adversely affects an individual's employment by unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or by creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment. Today, most companies have a written policy against harassment, which is generally distributed to employees. The anti-harassment policy should direct the employee as to whom to complain to regarding the offensive conduct without fear of retaliation. After receipt of the complaint, the company is legally obligated to investigate the allegations and take prompt remedial action to stop the harassing behavior. A company can be held liable if it fails to take prompt remedial action sufficient to stop the offensive behavior. Additionally, any adverse action by the company against the employee for reporting the harassing conduct can subject the company to legal action for retaliation.

An anti-harassment policy can help protect the employer from legal action in certain circumstances, such as when an employee fails to bring a claim of harassment to its attention. Under some circumstances, if the employee fails to report the conduct which the company could not Area Professional Women.



have reasonably known about, than the company will have a valid defense if the employee attempts to take legal action to hold the company responsible for the offensive conduct. As such, if you are being subjected to harassing and offensive behavior in the workplace, you are well advised to review the facts and circumstances surrounding the harassing conduct with legal counsel to be certain that your legal rights are being addressed without fear of retaliation. 





tion has awarded its 2002 grants totaling \$10,000 to five local nonprofits.

At its "Toast to the Winners" reception on the Hill 'n' Dale Farm before some 80 invited guests, the charities received their checks from Frederica Smith-Pederson, member of the grant review committee. The event was sponsored by Harris Bank Barrington.

Barrington Area Arts Council received \$1,500 to start a collaborative program for older adults to share experiences and life stories for the benefit of all ages in understanding the sequence of our lives.

Barrington Area Council on Aging's check for \$1,000 will be used to present a six-part course of training for local caregivers for elderly family members.

Barrington Youth Services will sponsor a program to strengthen local Hispanic family ties and help their children adjust to different cultures with a grant of \$1,500.

The LaFarge program, a start-up recipient from last year, will receive \$2,000 to continue building its senior education program using volunteer active or retired teachers and professors in the area.

New Generations will receive \$4,000 to prepare and present a leadership training program that will engage high-school-age youth to participate in community activi-

Mrs. Smith-Pederson reported that the committee received 15 requests totaling \$60,925, and that the committee rigorously applied its standards: to benefit the nonprofits.

The Barrington Area Community Founda- Barrington area, not duplicate existing programs, aid groups with limited fundraising capability, have no or very limited government involvement, and that the grant would make a substantial difference in the program for which the grant has been requested.

In opening remarks, foundation president Norval Stephens thanked Harris Bank Barrington for its support not only for this event but for being one of the first to make a five-year commitment to the foun-

"This event salutes our third series of annual grants, which this year were increased by one-third over 2001 because we had the most successful year ever, virtually doubling our endowment to \$400,000. We make our grants based on our formula of giving away 5 percent of our net assets averaged over the trailing 12 quarters," Stephens added.

At the event, the foundation announced its support by acting as the fiscal agent for "Leave a Legacy," a national public awareness program to encourage the general public to establish charitable gifts through their wills and bequests. Barrington area nonprofits, legal and financial advisors have developed and will launch a program this fall tailored to our community.

The foundation was started in 1997 with the mission of addressing unmet needs in the Barrington area defined as the greater School District #220 and BACOG. In three years, it has disbursed \$22,500 to 13 local

Comments by Thomas Constant and Never-Ending Improvement

On August 17 I celebrated my 32nd year of being in love with capturing images using the medium of photography. I received my first camera on my tenth birthday as a gift from my uncle. It was then that I first discovered how the power of images could capture and hold emotion.



I have been working diligently to improve my ability of accurately interpreting individuals and relationships. The methods used in photography have changed little over time. I have been working with chemicals and silver gelatin printing methods, as did the old masters. In the last several years I have fallen in love with an alternative printing method of using watercolor paper for black and white photography, known as Geclée prints (pronounced "jee clay"). I am delighted with the warm and soft qualities and excited about the ability to capture souls through the eyes with a new intensity. Geclée images yield a softer quality print with a wider range of high and low tones then silver gelatin printing. I have studied this new method and I am determined to adopt it for my future portrait work. Many people in the fine art world are moving in this direction, including students of Ansel Adams who have said that if Ansel were alive today, he would embrace these new printing methods.

Those who collect my work and who have built a relationship with me over the years know that I am very passionate about the things I believe in. Next year I will embark on my 25th anniversary of creating portraiture, and will be using this new printing method in a totally remodeled studio. We have redesigned our camera room, viewing room, production and framing areas to better serve you. We are intensely committed to create images that tell the truth about you and your loved ones. I believe these images will grow in value over time with their ability to capture and preserve emotions that can be relived years after the image was created.

"Pearls" to be Viewed by Art Associates

Pearls, nature's perfect gem, are the only gems formed by a living organism. They emerge perfectly luminous, not needing to be cut or polished.


On Sept. 26, The Barrington Community Associates of The Art Institute of Chicago will sponsor a bus trip to the "Pearls" exhibit. The collection includes over half a million pearls of every size, shape and color, ranging from white to pink, gold to purple and black. The 600 objects in the exhibition range from ancient fossil pearls to the exquisite jewelry of queens and celebrities.

Pearls have been associated with wealth, virtue, purity and glamour. It is believed that Chinese naturalists in the fifth century B.C.E. produced the first cultured pearls by inserting a miniature Buddha into a mussel to begin the pearl-making process. In the 18th century, the botanist Linnaeus invented a technique for producing the first spherical cultured pearls. Japan's pearl farmers in the 20th century refined techniques to make pearls more plentiful and inexpensive.

Muscatine, Iowa became the "pearl button capital of the world" by 1900. Using the North American freshwater pearl mussels in 1887, John Frederich Boepple produced mother-of-pearl novelty items and, later, buttons. Soon, his company out-produced European button centers.

Today, pearl-producing mollusks, especially the North American freshwater pearl mussels, are threatened by environmental changes, and a piece of mussel shell from the Mississippi watershed is used to seed nearly every cultured pearl grown.

elry proclaiming your everlasting love and c. 1880 to 1901, also known as the Aesdevotion? The early Victorian era, 1837 to 1861, is also known as the Romantic Period. This era inspired such amorous jewelry, which will be featured at M.J. Miller & Company on Sept. 6 and 7.

A jewel in the heart of Barrington, M.J. Miller & Company serves as an alluring showcase for "Turn-of-the-Century Jewelry." The mid-Victorian era, c. 1861 to 1880, also known as the Grand Period, required larger, more colorful jewelry as dictated by fashion. Contrasting markedly with concurring styles is Edwardian jewelry, c. 1890 to 1920. The Edwardian period emphasized platinum, pearls and diamonds in skillfully-worked designs. One of the most distinctive aspects of Edwardian jewels is their lacy, delicate appearance, made possible by the use of platinum, an extremely strong yet malleable metal. The negligee pendant, uniquely Edwardian, is a pair of pendant drops suspended from unequal lengths of fine chain. The drops are often pear-shaped pearls or gemstones.







Back to School

The theme of this month's issue of Lifestyles is "Back to School."

Ah! The pursuit of wisdom! So let's discuss wisdom, or more specifically, wisdom teeth, since wisdom is not my area of expertise.

Just the words "wisdom tooth" are synonymous with pain and suffering. But why are these teeth a problem? Wisdom teeth are the third and last molars to erupt into our jaws. If they grow into proper position behind the second molars, they can be useful and cause no problems.

In modern man, however, our jaws are usually not long enough to accommodate these teeth. Some have speculated that this is because our jaws do not develop to their fullest due to softer diets than primitive people were forced to cope with.

For whatever reason, these teeth frequently grow in sideways or only erupt partway out of the gums. In this position, they are trapped behind the second molars in a fluid-filled sac. This sac accumulates bacteria, resulting in a painless, chronic infection. This infection destroys good bone around the second molar, a lot of time and suffering. eventually causing the loss of both teeth.

In most cases, it is a good idea to have these teeth evaluated and usually removed during adolescence. If these teeth are not fully developed, they have shorter roots and removal results in fewer complications. In my practice, patients are referred to an oral surgeon who is a dentist that specializes in wisdom tooth removal and other surgical procedures. Comprehensive dental examinations followed by action, not procrastination, will save adolescents





The Field of Esthetic Skin Care

Through the techniques employed by a licensed esthetician, you can improve and enhance the appearance of your skin. Whether you are trying to maintain your skin after a surgical procedure or just want better-looking skin, there is a treatment for you. Based on scientific principles, the treatments are custom-designed for your skin's particular needs. Esthetic skin care can reduce the depth of surface lines, help fade abnormal brown spots, smooth rough skin and help clear up acneprone skin. Overall, it can give your skin a more youthful and healthier glow. The treatments are only done by a qualified, licensed esthetician in a physician's office and involve various methods of exfoliation, skin bleaching and rehydration. These treatments, when combined with a daily regimen, can give dramatic results.

What is an Esthetician?

A licensed esthetician is someone who has gone through specialized schooling and passed a state licenser exam to allow them to take care of the skin from an esthetic or beauty standpoint. Licensed estheticians have applied their specialized training in a medical setting under the oversight of a physician. Skin feels softer and smoother and appears younger looking. Three or more consecutive days of temperatures above 85 degrees is considered a heat wave and can pose heat-related dangers such as heatstroke/sunstroke, heat cramps or heat exhaustion.

In anticipation of the hot weather, the council is gathering names of individuals who would like to receive "wellness calls" on extremely hot days. If you are interested in being added to this list, please call

The people most at risk from heat-related illnesses are the elderly, small children, persons with weight problems and those taking certain kinds of medications. sweating or when a salt imbalance occurs Heat-Related. from too much sweating.

There are a number of things you can do to prevent heat-related illnesses. Reduce or eliminate strenuous activity; wear light-colored, lightweight clothes; drink plenty of water; avoid alcohol; and stay out of the sun. Seniors are also encouraged to remain indoors and use air conditioning or fans for cooling. For those of you without air conditioning, we encourage you to seek cooling centers, which include your village hall and the Barrington Municipal Center. What is Orthodontics?

It is essential for an excellent orthodontic result that a treatment plan be based on a sound diagnosis.

This morning, I read an article on financial security by Ric Edelman of the firm Edelman Financial Services. Ric is the author of several books, including the bestseller Ordinary People, Extraordinary Wealth and Financial Security in Troubled Times. In the article on Hidden Threats to Your Financial Security, he explains some financial threats and some safety nets that we might consider.

One, of course, was having a cash reserve to cover at least three months of expenses. Always a great idea.

Ric's next hidden threat was having too small of a mortgage. Most often, the perception is that it is better to pay off the home mortgage. Being mortgage-free is usually the best idea of all. 


