

### The Barrington Area Arts Council Opens its 2005 Gallery Season with Lives with Passion

With the waning of summer and the waxing of fall, September is the beginning of the Barrington Area Arts Council 2005 gallery season. For the next 12 months, the BAAC Gallery, the Gallery at the Garlands and the Gallery at the Library will offer the public 20 exhibitions of original art created by more than 50 local, state and national artists.

Sept. 9 will be the artist reception for the first exhibitions of the year, Lives with Passion, portraits by Thomas Balsamo, and Scene through the Lens, photographs by Julie Smith. The shows are an extraordi-

nary collection of black-and-white images. If these exhibits are an example of what's to come in future months, then the council is setting the bar very high. It promises to be a very exciting year at the galleries.

Lives with Passion is a collaborative exhibition presented by the Barrington Area Arts Council and the Barrington Area Council on Aging. The collection of 39 in- arts. The vision for Lives with Passion was terpretive black-and-white portraits and

The groundwork for the exhibition was laid in 2000, when the Barrington Area Arts Council and the Barrington Area Council on Aging came together to present Tales of Life, a program that connected mature adults with experiences in the born out of this program. With the nurturing of dedicated staff and volunteers from BAAC and BACOA and the artistic talent of Mr. Balsamo, the idea has come to life with passion.

"My life has been touched many times over by the wisdom and experience of aging people," said Thomas Balsamo. "I think of my grandma, Mary. She was the wisest person I ever knew. My objective for this collection of interpretative portraits is to capture a glimpse into the souls of people who are aging. Originally, I thought that wisdom would be the overshadowing quality. Surprisingly, that is not what I found. I discovered wisdom, yes, but the most powerful element turned out to be passion.

Lives with Passion captures the spirit of mature adults whose lives are influenced by a personal passion to create or to give back to others. The portraits are of people who live in Barrington and the surrounding area. The viewer may find a familiar face; but beyond, that face reveals an individual who is driven to create. These men and women express themselves through the arts or handcrafts or use their gifts and their vision to strengthen and shape communities. The striking blackand-white images, accompanied by narratives and quotes, challenge the viewer to reflect upon the powerful impact that passion, creativity and caring can have on the quality of one's life and community. The portraits evoke the question, "Do passion and caring have the power to make us ageless?"

"I always wanted to be an artist, before I knew what an artist was,' said Richard Felden, artist, age 85.

"I never think about my age. It's coming anyway," commented Rowena Swan, genealogist, age 96.

The councils invite the public to a reception for the artist on Friday,

Sept. 9, from 7 to 9 p.m. at the BAAC Gallery and the BAAC Gallery at the Garlands. View the artwork, meet the artist and partake in the refreshments.

Lives with Passion will be on view at both galleries through Sept. 29. The exhibit will be shown as a complete body of work at the BAAC Gallery at the Garlands during the month of October.



### Protecting Your Legal Rights— **Voluntary Resignation** by Joette S. Doran, Esq.

In an employment at-will relationship, an employee may voluntarily resign at any time. However, before voluntarily resigning, you should carefully consider the consequences of voluntary resignation, such as the potential waiver of your legal rights, including your right to unemployment compensation. Other considerations include the impact upon your service requirements to qualify for pension or other benefits. In that regard, you should carefully review all documents that impact the calculation of benefits under those plans. Significantly, if you are being subjected to illegal harassment, before quitting, you



should carefully consider your legal rights. This is especially true where the employer has a written policy against harassment.

The federal antidiscrimination statutes, such as Title VII (race, gender, religion or national origin), the Age Discrimination in Employment Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act, were created to protect employees from illegal discrimination and harassment. Harassment is generally defined as unwelcome conduct, which adversely affects an individual's employment environment. Today, most companies have a written policy against harassment, which is generally distributed to employees. The antiharassment policy should direct the employee as to whom to complain regarding the offensive conduct without fear of retaliation. After receipt of the complaint, the employer is legally obligated to investigate the allegations and take prompt action to stop the harassing behavior. It is illegal to take any adverse action against the employee for reporting the harassing conduct. Where an enforceable policy exists, if you voluntarily leave a company due to illegal hamay not be found liable for illegal dis-

crimination. Particularly, an antiharassment policy that directs the employee to report a claim of harassment can help protect the employer from legal action in certain circumstances where the employee does not report the harassment and where the employer could not have reasonably known about the harassment without a complaint being made by the employee. As such, it is highly recommended that you seek legal counsel before making the decision to voluntarily resign, as failure to do so could adversely impact your legal rights. iation, skin bleaching and rehydration. These treatments, when combined with a daily regimen, can give dramatic results.

### What is an Esthetician?

A licensed esthetician is someone who has gone through specialized schooling and passed a state licenser exam to allow them to take care of the skin from an esthetic or beauty standpoint. Licensed estheticians have applied their specialized training in a medical setting under the oversight of a physician. This allows the esthetician to perform stronger peels and somewhat more aggressive treatments than could be done elsewhere. A myriad of different procedures can be performed. The particular treatment (or combination) is chosen in the consultation process and is based on that patient's particular need and skin condition. A partial listing of available options include: different strength peels to treat fine lines and wrinkles, special peels to treat irregular pigment, peels to clear up blemishes and microdermabrasion.

### What is a Micropeel?

This technique involves a double-exfoliation process. The first exfoliation is done manually with a #10 scalpel. It removes a micro-thin layer of dead skin cells and keratin that lay on the skin surface, preventing skin care products from penetrating. The second exfoliation is done by applying a peel solution to the surface. This is done lightly, and only a slight tingle will be felt with this step. Finally, extractions of blocked oil pores can be performed before applying a moisturizer and sun block. ### What is Microdermabrasion?


Microdermabrasion is a nonsurgical, noninvasive method for removing dead, flaking skin cells while stimulating the production of fresh skin cells and collagen. Treatments are administered by our esthetician, using a hand piece through which microcrystals are vacuumed. This gentle abrasion produces a polished appearance in as little as 20 minutes. Skin feels softer and smoother and appears younger looking. For best results, we recommend an initial six-week treatment plan consisting of one treatment per week, followed by treatment once monthly.





### **Adults and Fractured Teeth**

As young people, many adults in the United States were not exposed to quality dentistry or could not afford it. We grew up prior to fluoridated water, sealants to prevent cavities in grooves and the current concepts of oral hygiene.

Almost everyone had cavities. Dentists usually watched a cavity grow until it was large enough to warrant a silver filling or amalgam, as it is properly called. Placement of an amalgam at this point structurally weakened the tooth. Amalgams have poor compressive strength, meaning that over time and under the pressure of biting and chewing, they crack and wear, subjecting the remaining tooth to excessive forces. This is the reason that many adults frequently fracture their back teeth.

In addition, as these amalgams age, they corrode, causing the edges of the filling itself to break down and allow the entry of saliva and decay-causing bacteria into the tooth. Since these fillings were originally large and close to the tooth's nerve, these teeth often require root canal therapy after being exposed to the bacteria.

These problems are neither the fault of the dentist nor the patient. However, they can usually be prevented by the use of porcelain or gold inlays, instead of silver fillings at the time the cavity is initially detected. Porcelain and gold restorations by James T. Gavrilos, DDS



seal the tooth better; they are stronger and more resistant to wear than amalgams. Instead of wearing and cracking under the forces, they actually become stronger.

Once the damage is done, however, the dentist has limited options. They are forced to suggest a more expensive as well as extensive restoration, such as a crown. Unfortunately, this is a fact in adult dental care. Insurance companies try to control their costs by limiting benefits to their policyholders and encouraging the repair of teeth with the weaker amalgam material. The cost to the insuring company is less now, but it will be more to you, the patient, later when the tooth fractures—at this point, you are retired and no longer covered under their policy.



### **Estate Planning: Basic Documents Every Adult Should Consider**

Every adult, regardless of age or wealth, should have an estate plan. This holds especially true for anyone who has children, owns property, or is a business owner. By properly structuring your estate, you can attain your financial goals during your lifetime and after your death.

Good estate planning allows you to control the transfer of your wealth to your loved ones and the charities that are important to you, while reducing or eliminating the taxes that may be owed by your estate. While you are living, a good estate plan can help you manage your assets and other legal issues using a durable power of attorney and can address health care decision making use of advanced health care directives

The right estate planning decisions can be made with the needs and planning concerns of several generations in mind. Your dreams for your children and grandchildren can be fulfilled with even greater success if parents and children share their estate planning goals and strategies. Without adequate planning, your estate may not be distributed the way you would have wanted and your biggest beneficiary could be your least favorite relative-Uncle Sam. Following are basic estate plan documents, which, if not already in place, should be considered

A Will gives you the ability to direct how assets held in your name are distributed after your death. If not specifically directed through your Will, those assets will be distributed according to the laws of the state in which you live. A Will is also used to handle non-financial matters such as appointing an executor or personal representative to manage your estate. For people with young children, a Will is typically used to nominate a guardian.

### **Revocable Trust**

Having a revocable living trust allows the assets held in trust to pass directly to beneficiaries without going through probate. This reduces the time and a cost associated with court and keeps the transfer of property private. Because you keep complete control over the trust and its assets during your lifetime, the property held in the trust is included in your gross federal estate for tax purposes

### Credit Shelter/Bypass Trust

Current estate tax law allows individuals to pass up to \$1.5 million to someone other than their spouse before they begin

paying estate tax. Quite often, this transfer is done through a Bypass Trust (often called Credit Shelter Trust). Each spouse creates a bypass trust, leaving up to \$1.5 million to the trust at their death. Their family members are named as beneficiaries. (The \$1.5 million represents the maximum applicable exemption that is free from taxes for 2004 and 2005. This exemption will increase in stages to \$3.5 million by 2009.) When the first spouse dies, the survivor has use of the income from the bypass trust until he or she dies. In addition, the principal is available to be used for the living spouse's health, education, maintenance and support. After the survivor dies, the trust principal passes to family (typically the children) free of estate taxes, as does the value of the maximum applicable exemption from the survivor's own trust.

Another important element to be aware of when establishing your estate plan is legislative changes. Congress may change current rules at any time. There is also a sunset provision for current rules that could automatically change these exemption amounts in 2011 if Congress fails to act to permanently change the federal estate tax rules

### Power of Attorney/ **Health Care Directives**

A durable power of attorney appoints a person to manage your financial and legal affairs in the event you become incapacitated. Advanced health care directives and a living Will specify your wishes concerning medical treatment in the event you are unable to make that choice for yourself. Your living Will should be as complete and explicit as possible to ensure your wishes are respected.

Regardless of which documents comprise your estate plan, it's important to review your plan with your financial advisor on a regular basis. Unless there is a major life change such as birth, death, marriage or divorce in the family, reviewing your estate plan once every three years should be adequate as a good rule of thumb. Your financial advisor can work with your legal and tax advisors to help you manage your estate.

### Gum Recession—What Does it Mean?

Exposed roots are the result of gum recession, not the natural aging process. There are many factors that contribute to a receding gumline. First, receding gums may be caused by bone loss beneath the gums, which cannot be seen. The supporting bone of the tooth could be deteriorating without the patient realizing it.
