Illinois Children Affected by War Receive Scholarships to Camp Courage

Camp Courage, Hospice of Northeastern Illinois' unique grief camp for children dealing with loss, is offering free scholarships to children who have had a family member die in war.

According to camp co-director Terry Rasmussen, more than 1,200 children have lost parents in the Iraq and Afghanistan wars. "Thousands more have a sibling, aunt, uncle or other relative who died in war," she says. "In the midst of crisis, the ongoing needs of mourning children are often overlooked.

With a ratio of two children to one counselor, the four-day camp is especially

Plastic Surgery and People's Fears

Many people think and talk about getting plastic surgery for years but fear prevents them from taking that final step and actually carrying through with it. Their concerns are understandable, and undergoing surgery is certainly not something to be taken lightly. Yet many of these fears can be eased with a little more knowledge and some accurate information.

Fear of the Results

A facelift is probably the procedure most feared by patients. One concern they have complain about pain. is that a facelift won't look natural; nobody wants to look pulled or too tight. The goal is to look refreshed and not as if surgery was performed. So how is this accomplished? Rather than depending on extensive skin undermining and pulling tightening the deeper layers beneath the skin. This lifts and tightens the skin in a more natural way, distributing the tension from beneath the skin rather than directly from the incisions. The result is a faster recovery, a longer lasting result and a very natural look. This technique also minimizes the tension on the incisions resulting in far better healing.

How to Choose a Dance School for Your Child

Many parents of young children who desire to take dance lessons find themselves unsure as to how to choose a school. Frankly, a recommendation from a neighbor or friend is not enough. You should always visit the school in person. The following are some guidelines as to how to choose a school in order to insure your child's proper instruction and personal safety

Facility—The dancers should have a large room with a special sprung floor. Dancing on concrete covered with tile or other hard surfaces is dangerous. There should be ample mirrors and well-constructed ballet barres for older students.

Observation of Classes-Before enrolling in any school, you should make an appointment to observe a class. Even if you are not knowledgeable, you will be able to judge certain critical things.

1) Is the teacher well organized and pleasant?

2) Is he/she knowledgeable? (Check the school brochure for teachers' backgrounds.) happy with for years to come!


3) Are the teacher's corrections made clearly and in a positive way?

4) Are the students well behaved and attentive for their age?



Hate My Teeth!

Those words are heard in dental offices every day. But when the dentist asks the patient, "What do you hate about them?" the answer is usually, "I don't know, I just hate them!'

So many factors contribute to the appearance of teeth. These factors may not be clearly identifiable by the patient but are clearly evident to the dentist that has had training in smile design. When evaluating a smile, the dentist needs to ask himself many questions. Are the edges of the teeth worn? What is the patient doing to wear them down? Do the gums show when smiling? If they show, do they appear to follow the lips or are they canted? Do the edges of the upper teeth follow the shape of the lower lip? Do the upper teeth show while the patient is speaking? Does the midline of the upper teeth line up with the midline of the lower teeth? Do the teeth have a "windswept" appearance that makes the spaces between the teeth look angled? Is the pointed gum tissue that drops down between the teeth even from one side to the other? Is the tooth color appropriate for the patient? The list goes on and on, and it's important to identify what the problem is before trying to fix it.



How do we know if these changes for the patient are the right ones? The dentist can take digital photos of the teeth and make any of the above changes. He can sit down with the patient and show them what their smile could look like. If the patient is pleased, the dentist can then discuss with them their options for treat-

Thank the Salvation Army for Your Morning Donut

The next time you dunk your favorite donut, thank The Salvation Army

While the organization may not have invented the donut-that distinction is lost to history—it can certainly take credit for the popularity of donuts today.

June 2 and 3rd marks the 68th anniversary of Salvation Army "Donut Day" in metropolitan Chicago. The tag day was originally established in 1938 to honor the work of members of The Salvation Army who prepared donuts for thousands of soldiers in World War I. Their donuts and compassion were responsible, in large part, for the affection and esteem held by the American public for the organization. They also stimulated an Amer-

ican taste for the "sinkers"—a taste which to help in their recovery. didn't exist beforehand.

This year, The Salvation Army will again provide donors with the familiar tag day, paper donuts. The tags can be redeemed at area Dunkin' Donuts and Country Donut franchises for free donuts.

The army hopes to raise \$10,000 in the two-day, street solicitation. According to Captain David Werner of The Salvation Army in Crystal Lake, the funds donated will be used to support the army's Emergency Disaster Services program in Mc-Henry County. Through that program, victims of fires and natural disasters are given emergency food and shelter, clothing,

Background

Donut Day was established in 1938 as a means to raise much-needed operating funds for The Salvation Army and also as a tribute to Salvation Army "lassies" that made and served donuts to thousands of soldiers during World War I.

While the spelling of "doughnut" has household items and basic furniture items shortened to "donut" over the years, the

The Salvation Army ever since World War I. Though Donut Day was observed fairly extensively, especially after World War II by The Salvation Army throughout the United States, the army in metropolitan Chicago has the longest continuous successful celebration of this event, now a 68-year-old tradition.

The Beginning...

In August, 1917, the fighting raged near Montiers, France, as soldiers huddled in camp. They were hungry, weary and drenched by 36 consecutive days of rain. In a tent near the front lines, Salvation Army lassies filled a refuge pail with oil, made dough with leftover flour and other ingredients on hand, and used a wine bottle as a rolling pin. With a baking powder tin for a cutter and a camphorice suck tube for making the holes, the donuts were fried, seven at a time, in soldiers' steel helmets on an 18-inch stove. (Later, a seven-pound shell fitted with a onepound shell was used to cut out the donut

Rain fell continuously, and the watersoaked tent finally collapsed. However, the 100 donuts made that first day were an immediate success. Soon, as many as 500 soldiers stood in muck outside the resurrected tent waiting for the sweet taste of donuts. Before long, they were made around the clock. The tent became the first 24-hour donut shop with a total of 9,000 donuts.

Word spread, though the basic recipe

popular pastry has been the trademark of for making the donuts greatly varied from unit to unit. Before long, Salvation Army lassies were making donuts wherever the war was being fought. Donuts were taken to the front lines, and it was reported that some pilots even dropped notes asking for donuts for their troops.

Donuts Invade Home Front

Following the war, the returning 'doughboys' brought back the taste of donuts with them—the donuts fried and served to them in France. Although unknown in the states, donuts had become wartime fa-

In France, Salvation Army donut supplies were unable to keep pace with the constant demand. Once back home, returning soldiers continued to ask for donuts, which were virtually unknown in the states. One by one, bakeries responded to the need and, again, the donut was an instant success—only this time on American soil.

However, the donut's identity with The Salvation Army stuck. Donuts appeared everywhere the army did. Ever since that August day in France almost 90 years ago, millions of servings of hot coffee and donuts have been provided by The Salvation Army to fireman, rescue workers, disaster victims—anyone in need and always without cost. Salvation Army lassies made donuts the popular wartime food, and the donut came to symbolize the good work of The Salvation Army.
