#### Back to School

The theme of this month's Barrington Lifestyles magazine is "Back to School."

Ah, the pursuit of wisdom! So let's discuss wisdom, or more specifically, wisdom teeth, since wisdom is not my area of ex-

Just the words "wisdom tooth" are synonymous with pain and suffering. But why are these teeth a problem? Wisdom teeth are the third and last molars to erupt into our jaws. If they grow into proper position behind the second molars, they can be useful and cause no problems.

In modern man, however, our jaws are usually not long enough to accommodate these teeth. Some have speculated that this is because our jaws do not develop to their fullest due to softer diets than primitive people were forced to cope with.

For whatever reason, these teeth frequently grow in sideways or only erupt partway out of the gums. In this position, they are trapped behind the second molars in a fluid-filled sac. This sac accumulates bacteria, resulting in a painless, chronic infection. This infection destroys good bone around the second molar, eventually causing loss of both teeth.

The problem may develop into a tumor fever. This seems to occur at inopportune

moments like before school exams or weddings. Wisdom teeth may even grow directly into the second molars, causing damage.

In most cases, it is a good idea to have these teeth evaluated and usually removed during adolescence. If these teeth are not fully developed, they have shorter roots and removal results in fewer complications. In my practice, patients are referred to an oral surgeon who is a dentist that specializes in wisdom tooth removal and other surgical procedures. Comprehensive dental examinations following by action, not procrastination, will save adolescents a lot of time and suffering.

#### **Implant Placement Procedure**

1. Dental implants can support a fixed bridge, eliminating the need for a removable partial denture.

2. Implants are placed into the jawbone. After this surgical treatment, the bone in the jaw attaches to the implants, holding them firmly in place. The attachment of bone to the implant usually takes three to six months.

3. Small posts are attached to the implant, projecting through the gums. Several weeks after this second procedure the replacement crown can be fabricated.

4. Replacement teeth are created and securely attached to the small posts.





# What Age is Best for Certain Procedures?

Patients often ask at what age it is best to get certain procedures done. This will vary from patient to patient, but there are some general guidelines that apply in most cases. Ultimately, only the patient along with their surgeon can determine if a certain procedure is right for them or if the timing is appropriate.

**Eyelid Rejuvenation** 

Most people will notice the aging process first around their eyes. Some puffiness beneath the eyelids, especially in the morning, will get more and more noticeable. This can create a tired look even Chemical peeling is designed to smooth when the person is well rested. Although some people will notice this in their twenties, this usually becomes more apparent in the thirties and forties. Although both upper and lower eyelids may age simultaneously, some people will notice only one or the other aging sooner.

### You Say It's Your Birthday?

Here are some choices and opportunities that come with reaching a "milestone" age in 2006.

Age 50: You become eligible to make extra "catch-up," contributions to your retirement plan. This year, the 401(k) catchup amount is \$5,000, which brings the total contribution allowed to \$20,000. For an IRA, the catch-up amount is \$1,000 expanding the total limit to \$5,000.

Age 55: If you leave your job or retire, you may withdraw savings from your 401(k) without paying a 10% early withdrawal penalty. However, you will need to pay income tax, unless you roll the money into an IRA or another 401(k).

Age 591/2: You may withdraw money from a 401(k) or your IRA without paying the 10% penalty. You'll have to pay income tax, unless you roll the money into an IRA or another 401(k).

Age 60: If you are a widow or widower, you are eligible to start receiving Social Security but it might be reduced depending on whether your spouse had reached full retirement age. A disabled widow or widower may be eligible as early as age

Age 62: You're eligible to start receiving Social Security, though if you wait (up until age 70), your benefit will be higher. Another reason to delay is that if you receive Social Security prior to full retirement age while earning money from a job, your benefit will be reduced if your earnings exceed the annual limit.

Age 65: You're now entitled to Medicare coverage. Take it, even if you don't plan to go on Social Security yet. Medicare and You 2006 is a good, basic source of information (go to www.medicare.gov for a

Age 701/2: You must start withdrawing money from your Traditional IRA (but not a Roth IRA) in the form of a "required minimum distribution" (RMD). Failure to take an RMD will result in a 50% tax penalty on the balance not withdrawn.
