


HARPS Picnic and Farm Fest a Delight

More than 200 people attended the HARPS Picnic and Farm Fest on Sunday Sept. 17. The event filled the hours between noon and 4 p.m. with a wide variety of entertainment for people of all ages, whether they were playing games, dancing, relaxing in the sunshine, or enjoying the equine performances and pony rides.

Horses were everywhere, both as exhibits and as entertainment. The horse program, "Equine Extravagance," featured Barrington's own Susan Gohl and Chris Taylor, elegant dressage riders who performed a breathtaking pas de deux on their beautiful warmbloods. Spectators thrilled to the exciting performance and eye-catching red, white and blue costumes and flags of the Timmerman Ranch Drill Team. Two members of the ten-horse drill team opened the show: one galloped around the arena carrying the American flag while the other sang our national anthem, The Star-Spangled Banner. The HARPS "Parade of Horses" gave spectators the chance to see some of the many Illinois horses that have been saved by HARPS—the eleven horses in the parade



CTRF Raises an Unprecedented \$1.3 Million in One Night

15th Anniversary Celebration Yields Big Return

Commemorating its 15th Anniversary on Saturday, Nov. 4, Cancer Treatment Research Foundation (CTRF) celebrated the impact CTRF-funded research has had over the past 15 years and raised funds for vital cancer research programs, netting \$1.3 million.

During the evening, guests heard from one survivor who has been cancer-free since participating in a CTRF-funded study and a special auction was held to raise money specifically to continue that study.

The study, conducted by Dr. Mary "Nora" Disis of the University of Washington, is exploring the effects of a combination vaccine-chemotherapy for women with metastasized breast cancer, an advanced form of breast cancer. The event raised just over \$300,000 to continue this pioneering research.

"We're amazed and very grateful to our donors for their generosity during the evening," stated Alicia Stephenson, CTRF's chair of the board. "And with generous underwriting from a major donor and our presenting sponsor, National City Bank, we're able to direct 99 cents of every dollar raised on Saturday to cancer research programs."

More than 800 people from across the country attended the milestone event.

The Legal Importance of **Anti-Discrimination Policies** and Employee Training by Joette S. Doran, Esq.

Although there has been increased attention to the issues of discrimination and harassment, employee claims remain steady, subjecting employers to liability. Almost a decade ago, the U.S. Supreme Court addressed the importance of the actions that should be taken by employers to prevent employee discrimination and harassment. Since then, federal decisions have stressed the use of employee policies and training in educating employees regarding the issues of discrimination, harassment and retaliation. The first step toward the prevention of discrimination



claims is to have a written anti-harassment policy that is properly worded and distributed to all employees. The policy should

specifically define what constitutes illegal discrimination and should direct the employee where to make a complaint without the concern of retaliation.

While a written anti-harassment policy is the first step, providing employee training as to the provisions of the policy aids in the prevention of claims and liability. In fact, some federal courts have determined that merely having a policy against harassment without employee training, is insufficient to avoid liability. Employee training should be conducted by someone knowledgeable regarding the laws against discrimination so that all employees understand their rights and responsibilities as it relates to workplace harassment. The training should ensure that supervisors

and managers understand their responsibility under the employer's anti-harassment policy and complaint procedures. Due to the high level of daily interaction between employees, both employees and supervisors must be knowledgeable about what constitutes illegal behavior. Also, management and supervisors must be informed as to how to competently and legally handle issues of harassment. If the employer fails to appropriately respond to an employee complaint of harassment or retaliates against the employee for making a complaint, the employer may be subject to liability under federal and state laws. Ancient Philippine Art Form "Kut-Kut"

An ancient Philippine art form is coming to Barrington Area Arts Council's (BAAC) gallery at the Barrington Area Library. The lost art technique known as "kut-kut" will be on display now through Jan. 4. BAAC's gallery at the Barrington Area Library is located at 505 N. Northwest Highway.

Artist Fred DeAsis will be exhibiting his original kut-kut pieces along with some older works. "Art is my passion and compulsion. My mission is to revive the lost art and present to the public the beauty and rich history of the ancient art form from the Philippines," he says.

Kut-kut is an exotic Philippine art form involving sgraffito, encaustic and layering. These early century techniques merge together to produce a unique style of art constituting swirling interwoven lines, multilayered texture, and the illusion of threedimensional space.

DeAsis' creations are made by first treating a panel with clear emulsion, then spending many hours applying paint and medium. "My art pieces often take months to complete due to continuous layering, composing, and mixing of tints and dyes to the emulsion and lengthy drying time,"

DeAsis studied fine arts in Asia and Europe and participates in local and international art shows. He is an active member of the Arlington Heights Art Guild and the Chicago Artist Coalition. For additional information, visit his Web site at www. fdeasis.com.







Past Meets Future

Interior design takes on many shapes and forms. As a designer, it is my goal to assist my clients in making their home a wonderful reflection of their style and taste. I frequently encourage my clients to consider blending items from their past with the new furnishings which will complete their room's interior. It might be your family's heirloom Queen Anne armoire, a Hepplewhite dining chair, or a Biedermeier accent table. 








"Walk On" for Riders with Disabilities **Plan Holiday Party**




Implant Placement Procedure


1. Dental implants can support a fixed bridge, eliminating the need for a removable partial denture.



2. Implants are placed into the jawbone. After this surgical treatment, the bone in the jaw attaches to the implants, holding them firmly in place. The attachment of bone to the implant usually takes three to six months.



3. Small posts are attached to the implant, projecting through the gums. Several weeks after this second procedure the replacement crown can be fabricated.



New Tax Structure May Affect Your Retirement Accounts

The new Tax Increase Prevention and Reconciliation Act of 2005 (TIPRA) creates many challenges and opportunities for taxpayers. In 2010, for example, TIPRA lifts the \$100,000 income ceiling making high-income earners eligible for Roth IRA Conversions. Married taxpayers filing separately will also be allowed to convert from a Traditional IRA to a Roth IRA.

Additionally, TIPRA allows the taxes on Roth conversions in 2010 to be paid over the next two years (2011 and 2012) instead of all in the year of conversion. However, owners must leave converted funds in the Roth IRA for five years from the conversion date to withdraw the funds tax-free. Any distributions from a Roth conversion IRA before the five-year period will be subject to a 10% penalty.

You may want to consider a Roth conversion if:

- · You are many years from using these funds and therefore have the time to earn back the amount due for taxes when you convert your IRA.
- Your Traditional IRA has been opened for a short time and the contributions have been mostly nondeductible. Your tax liability will likely be low at conversion because taxes are paid only on the growth of the funds and on the deductible contributions.
- · You plan to leave the bulk of your IRA funds to heirs. Unlike a Traditional IRA, the Roth has no requirement to withdraw funds at age 70½, which gives you the potential to leave a larger and income tax-

free account to children or grandchildren.

- · You anticipate your tax bracket will remain the same or will be higher during
- · You can pay the taxes from sources outside the IRA. If you're under age 591/2, an additional penalty applies to funds withdrawn to pay the taxes.

If you don't have a Traditional IRA, you might want to fund an account for the next five years in anticipation of converting the account in 2010. If your contributions are nondeductible, you will owe taxes only on any growth in the account. If you have other IRAs, a pro-rata share of income in all your IRAs will be taxable.



Focus on Rhinoplasty

"It's as plain as the nose on your face."

This old adage says a lot about this central feature of our anatomy. Occupying the middle third of the face, probably no other single feature can so dramatically affect our appearance. The nose determines to a great extent the balance and symmetry of our faces. If one's nose is out of proportion to the rest of their features, it can dominate their looks. Someone who doesn't like their nose can focus on it, becoming self-conscious and insecure. A change in the appearance of their nose can make all the difference in the world to them. This is why rhinoplasty surgery is one of the most common plastic surgical procedures being performed in the United States today.

What is rhinoplasty?

changes the outer shape of the nose. This is accomplished by a combination of removing and/or repositioning cartilage and bone which is already present. The goal is to shape the nose in a natural way so it is balanced and in harmony with the rest of the face and does not appear to have been "done."

What is external rhinoplasty?

In traditional rhinoplasty there are multiple incisions made inside the nose in order to reach the cartilage and bone. In addition, the cartilage usually needs to be

"delivered" or pulled out of the nostril in order to operate on it.

External rhinoplasty is a technique we use in which one single incision is made starting just inside the nostril on one side and extending across the base of the nose to the other side. This allows the cartilage to be worked on in its natural position This is the part of nasal surgery that without distortion and provides a much greater visibility during the operation. Also, there is very little bleeding during external rhinoplasty due to the single incision. We have found this technique gives much better control and predictability of the final result. We can also eliminate the need to pack the nose which significantly reduces the post-operative discomfort. External rhinoplasty is used on the majority of our patients.

What is a septoplasty?

Tooth Whitening Procedures

Without a doubt, the most frequently asked questions in a dental office concern tooth whitening. Patients want to look their best, but with the tremendous amounts of advertising that bombards them, they turn to us for answers.

How does it work? All tooth-whitening procedures accomplish one thing: they penetrate the enamel with oxygen. The oxygen changes the way the enamel reflects light. Instead of absorbing some colors and reflecting the yellow ones out, it reflects all the colors out. White light in... white light out! The tooth whitener's effectiveness is based on two things; concentration and duration.

Whitening toothpaste—with a low concentration of oxygen and a short duration, it is the least-effective method for whitening. Rarely are the results reported

Over the counter whitening gelsbetter results than the toothpaste. Major problems in the past have been the ill-fitting mouth trays that can cause TMJ (bite/ jaw) problems or can cause gum irritation because they hold the whitening gel up against the gum tissue.

Whitening strips—Crest introduced these and they eliminated the TMJ and gum irritation issue associated with the over the counter gels. The patient places the strips on their teeth so that minimal gel is touching the gums and the strip is so thin, it doesn't alter the bite enough to cause a TMJ problem. The drawback has been the inability for the strips to reach the surface of the tooth as it curves in toward its contact point.

Professional tooth whitening-Den-






tists custom make trays that hold the whitening gels against and in between the teeth. This method is very effective because the custom fabrication allows the tray to keep the gel off of the tissue and will cause no TMJ problems. The trays are worn for an hour during the day and in some cases can be worn at night. Most of the gels require two weeks to reach their full whitening potential. If your teeth start to stain again, you can reuse the trays and purchase additional gel to touch them up.

Laser tooth whitening-this method is just as effective as professional tooth whitening with custom trays but the advantage is time. In just about 90 minutes your whitening is completely finished. The gels that are used for this process are so powerful; the gums must be isolated with special barriers. Bright lights help energize the gels and get the job done quickly. The cost is similar to that of the custom trays, but you cannot touch up after vour teeth stain again.

Advances in Varicose Vein Treatment

Varicose veins are enlarged veins in the vein treatment in 2001. The laser does not lower extremities that are caused when valves within the vein stop working properly. In a normal vein, valves help move the blood back towards the heart. When the valves no longer work properly, blood pools in the veins causing them to enlarge, this in turn causes pain. Fortunately, the veins deeper in the leg compensate for the compromised veins and blood is carried back to the heart without any problem. Symptoms of varicose veins include:

- · Pain, tiredness or heaviness in legs, especially after prolonged sitting or standing
 - · Swelling of ankles or lower legs
- · Bulging, "rope-y" veins under the surface of the skin
- · Skin discoloration and dryness around ankles

Varicose veins are not associated with serious health issues. However, varicosities left untreated can result in ulcerations, permanent skin discoloration and increasing pain over time. Wearing compression stockings and elevating your legs will help alleviate some of the symptoms, but will not eliminate the underlying problem.

The treatment for varicose veins has advanced significantly in the last five years. Previously, most varicose veins were treated through an operative procedure commonly known as "vein stripping." The procedure removes the vein, but the postoperative recovery is painful lasting several weeks. Now varicose veins can be treated in a physician's office with minimally invasive procedures. Large varicose veins can usually be eliminated through a procedure called endovenous laser ablation. The FDA approved laser devices for varicose

remove the varicose vein but actually seals it closed. Once the affected vein is closed, blood cannot pool in it. The lumpy varicose vein disappears and so does the associated pain. The endovenous laser procedure is relatively pain free. Patients are able to return to normal activities within several days.

This laser technology has increased the number of options available to patients. Vein centers and clinics abound in the area, making it difficult to determine where to get quality care. It might be best to begin the process by asking your family doctor for a recommendation or referral. After that, important questions to ask include:

- Is the physician board certified? What
- · How long has he/she been treating vein problems?
- · How long has he/she been performing endovenous laser procedures?
 - · What are my treatment options?

Be aware that doing a high volume of procedures does not necessarily translate into providing the best care. Look for a physician that is interested in treating you as a person not just your varicose veins, one who spends time with you and answers all of your questions. You should feel confident and secure that you are getting the best care.

Sleeping and eating become disrupted as well as social and vocational functioning. Something is not right with what is going on around us but also something is not right within us.

So when is worry beneficial and when isn't it?

Worry stops benefitting when it is a prolonged distraction, removes us from social events, stops us from functioning, results in self-blame, alters our emotions and behaviors, takes away our peace and happiness, and importantly does not lead to any change or improvement.

With counseling we can learn techniques that reduce anxiety, explore ways to "rethink" worries, and strategise ways to regain control and power over matters. 

is the septum. It is made up of cartilage in the front of the nose and bone further back. This is what divides the nose lengthwise into two separate sides. The septum is often "deviated" or crooked due to some type of trauma earlier in life. This can lead to sinus infections as well as a chronic stuffy nose. If the deviation is located just beneath the bridge of the nose, it can cause the external form to look crooked. During a septoplasty, both the cartilaginous and bony portions of the septum are

straightened and repositioned to the midline in order to improve the airway. This can be done as a separate operation or in conjunction with a rhinoplasty.





The Komodo dragon, the world's largest lizard, has a mouth packed with sharp teeth and deadly bacteria; the ability to track its prey for miles and miles; and the capability to devour an entire pig in 20 minutes! Found on only a few islands in Indonesia, these lizards can grow to over eight feet long, weigh up to 300 pounds, and are swift runners and swimmers. With their forked tongues and extraordinary size, it's no surprise people call them "dragons."

Shedd Aquarium happily welcomes Faust, the nearly eight-foot long, 120pound Komodo dragon from Fort Worth Zoo. The name "Faust" was chosen from a public naming contest. It is from the German-based legend of Faust, a man



who sold his soul to the devil but ultimately fell in love, thus discovering the full meaning of life. This broke his pact with the devil; consequently, Faust was believed to hold power over evil.

Komodos have ancestors that date back more than 100 million years. Discovered by Western scientists in 1910, they eat everything—including hooves, horns, bones and hide-except the contents of a digestive tract. They eat the intestines only after swinging them from side to side to empty the contents. They can go several weeks between meals. But when they decide to attack, nothing can stop them. In fact, aquarium staffers won't even be in the habitat with Faust when he gets poultry, rats and other meat during feeding time because Komodos are such voracious and indiscriminate eaters!

From the tiny day gecko to the world's longest lizard, the crocodile monitor, Lizards and the Komodo King will connect guests to more than 25 lizard species. Discover the remarkable colors, textures,



SHOOT FOR THE MOON

"A Journey with Jim Lovell," the first gallery of "Shoot for the Moon," tells the story of NASA astronaut Captain James A. Lovell, Jr.'s life and career using artifacts from his personal collection. The exhibition, at the Adler Planetarium in Chicago, shares the story of America's first journeys into space in the 1960s as told through the powerful narrative of Captain Lovell. It includes stories about Lovell's initial failures to gain acceptance into the U.S. Naval Academy and NASA astronaut program and ultimate success as a space pioneer; he flew on four missions and traveled to the Moon twice! Visitors will gain insights about the dramatic moments leading up to each of his Gemini missions, and how Lovell and others risked their lives to advance scientific understanding when manned space flight was still in its infancy.

"A Journey with Jim Lovell" is designed as an immersive, multipurpose gallery experience. The exhibition includes two multimedia presentations with original NASA footage from Lovell's Gemini and Apollo missions. The Gemini 12 spacecraft itself—fully-restored—is

the centerpiece of a dynamic show cele- brating the Gemini 12 mission and Amer-

ica's race to the Moon.

The second gallery of "Shoot for the Moon" will offer visitors the opportunity to walk in the boots of an explorer to experience the thrill of trying out for the astronaut program and flying in space.

The exhibition includes almost 30 artifacts from Lovell's personal collection, in addition to the fully-restored Gemini 12 spacecraft

Among the outstanding pieces in the exhibition are: Lovell's rejection letter from the Mercury Program in 1959, original flight plans and manuals flown on the Gemini 12 mission, Lovell's visual acuity test card from Gemini 7, Lovell's handwritten Gemini training notes and a full set of Gemini space program medallions.

Also included are some of the rocketry and science fiction books that inspired Lovell as a child, as well as other personal effects from his early years, including personal photos and diaries.

In October 2005, the Gemini 12 spacecraft traveled from the Goddard Space Flight Center to the Kansas Cosmosphere and Space Center in Hutchinson, Kansas, for restoration and preservation. The res-

toration process was completed in April 2006 and the spacecraft arrived at the Adler the morning of April 10, 2006.

Restoration of the capsule included taking an inventory of the spacecraft's condition and parts, fixing corrosion on the body and visible wear and deterioration on the interior. Lovell personally met with restoration experts at the Cosmosphere to go over details of the work and make sure the capsule was brought back to its post-flight appearance.

Lovell, veteran of four Gemini and Apollo missions, helped the Adler secure the Gemini 12 spacecraft on long-term loan from the Smithsonian's National Air and Space Museum.

Gemini 12 is the third Gemini capsule the Cosmosphere has restored. The others were Gemini 6 and Gemini 10.

Adler Planetarium is located at 1300 South Lake Shore Drive in Chicago.

Admission to "Shoot for the Moon" is free with general museum admission. General admission is \$7 for adults; \$6 for seniors; and \$5 for adult residents/children 417. Visit www.adlerplanetarium.org or call 1-312-922-STAR(7827) for details.





Chicago History Museum Features Dior: The New Look

As one of the most influential fashion designers of the twentieth century, Christian Dior revolutionized the fashion industry in 1947 with his first collection: the New Look. His designs expressed nostalgia, fantasy, opulence and femininity, creating an idealized image of womanhood that dominated fashion throughout the 1950s. The exhibition, Dior: The New Look, explores why the collection was so important to fashion and society, focusing on postwar America, its Chicago connection, and the women who loved this feminine style, as well as those who opposed it.

On Feb. 12, 1947, Christian Dior presented his collection to the public, and fashion mavens immediately predicted it would put Paris back on the map as the capital of fashion. The success of the New Look led to the opening of Christian Dior New York, making Christian Dior the first European designer with a ready-to-wear salon in the United States. By 1957, Dior products were available in 15 countries and Dior himself was featured on the cover of TIME magazine.

The exhibition allows for each of the ensembles to tell a story. Many of these pieces were altered after their original creation, and these changes are highlighted so the visitors can see how clothing sometimes changes to follow the latest trends



or due to a new owner. Also featured are specially designed undergarments that were created to mold and shape the female form into Dior's New Look silhouette of cinched waists and exaggerated hips.
