

### "Craftways: English Artisans in Seventeenth-Century New England"

The Milwaukee Art Museum is proud to present "Craftways: English Artisans in Seventeenth-Century New England," an exhibition featuring over 20 chests, chairs, and cupboards that demonstrate the woodworking techniques and designs carried to New England by immigrant English artisans. On view from Feb. 8 through May 27, 2007, the exhibition examines how English technological and artistic conventions, or "craftways," changed in response to their new social and physical environments. Six examples of this evolutionary process are presented in the exhibition: Persistence, Propagation, Hybridization, Synthesis, Assimilation and Adaptation.

Once in New England, immigrant woodworkers encountered unfamiliar environmental and cultural factors including new customers, new shipping routes, and much more timber than had been available in England. As these artisans adapted to new conditions, their lives, families, and "craftways" were rede-

The furniture on view provides clues about this process of change. One group of oak chests and boxes made in Marshfield, Mass. in the 1690s suggests that several families of craftsmen used different methods of construction and design. Once living and working together, however, they made new products that combined specific elements taken from each family. This demonstrates a synthesis of craftways. In contrast, a carved box made in Windsor, Conn. was made by craftsmen who deviated little from their English roots. Trained in a carving style that devel-

oped in Devon, England, these craftsmen continued to replicate traditional English patterns, demonstrating the persistence of their English craftway. The transplantation of these and other English furniture making craftways to New England helped define the visual landscape of early American communities.

This exhibition is organized by the Milwaukee Art Museum and the Chipstone Foundation; guest curated by Donald P. White III, independent scholar; and coordinated at the Milwaukee Art Museum by Sarah Fayen, assistant curator at the Chipstone Foundation and adjunct assistant curator at the Milwaukee Art Museum.

# Review: Wise Words from Women of a Certain Age


Mature women have a lot to say. The accumulated wisdom of a life time of experience is like an old well, ready to be tapped, but often forgotten. The accomplished women of the Congregational Unitarian Church in Woodstock decided to do something about it. They created their own book, Wise Words from Women of a Certain Age.

The women, ranging from 50 to more than 90 years of age, drew on a breadth of accomplishment and experience. They included professionals, educators, artists, business women, and homemakers. They have been moms and grandmas; been single, married, divorced and widowed. They have been healthy and ill, challenged by adversity and rewarded for achievement. As members of a Unitarian Universalist Church, they came from many faith traditions and each developed their own unique system of belief.

This is neither a how-to self-improvement manual, nor a brief for any particular belief system. Instead the women simply want to share what they have learned and invite the reader to participate.

The book is divided into several short chapters: love, family, friends, health, wealth, interests, attitude, challenges, death, wisdom, and a good life. Entries under each category range from pithy axioms, to longer reflections and snippets of personal experience. No contribution is attributed to a specific individual so that personal knowledge of the a writer does not color the reader's perception.

Some wisdom seems obvious. But obvious or not, it bears repeating because in the midst of busy lives we so often loose sight of the obvious. Other nuggets provide the perfect "Ah ha!" moment of recognition and enlightenment.



The authors want to encourage the reader's participation. To that end, their entries are printed only on the right-hand pages. The pages opposite are left blank as an invitation to set down personal re-




PHD Executive Director Cathy Vincus shares a playful moment with Viktoria Stasiowska of Prospect Heights, age 1.

#### Is a Promise of Continued Employment Legally Enforceable? by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

Recently an Illinois Appellate Court considered whether an employer's oral promise of continued employment constitutes a legally binding contract. In that case, the plaintiff left a previous employer to work for the defendant based on the representations that if the plaintiff accepted employment as the head of the employer's new department "he would be employed as long as it takes to successfully build the department and then as long as he desired." The plaintiff alleged that based on minated employee brought suit for breach those representations he left a higher paytwo months later, he was fired. tations to the employee during the interview process that he would be employed until the new department was "successfully established" and "for as long as he desired" were merely expressions of goodwill and hope and that the statements were not legally binding. In arriving at that conclusion the court looked to the general presumption of "employment at will" which provides that an employer may discharge for any reason at any time. An exception to that general presumption is an employment agreement for a specific duration which is clear and definite. In analyzing the employer's statements, the court found that the statement that he could work for "as long as he desired" was too vague and indefinite. Also, be-

cause the promise could not be per-

formed within a year, the promise is not legally enforceable as a contract unless committed to writing as required by under the statute of frauds. Accordingly, whether a promise for continued employment is enforceable requires careful legal analysis. For additional information, please visit our Web site at www.joettedoran.com.



## **Facelift Surgery**

Most people who are familiar with modern facelifts and other facial cosmetic procedures are aware of their important benefits, in terms of improved appearance as well as self-esteem. However, many people who are good candidates for these procedures may be reluctant to actually have them out of fear of the process itself.

They fear that they might experience pain during the surgery, or that recovery might bring pain or discomfort, or that it might take too long to heal, or that they might find some other aspect of the surgery unacceptable. The truth is that virtually every one of our patients reports that their recovery was faster and more comfortable than they expected.

In this context, I would like to share with you the comments of one of our recent facelift patients, a 53-year-old female. She was asked to respond to some very direct questions we posed about her experience with the facelift surgery. While some patients may report more difficult recoveries, this patient's experience is fairly typical.

The following is our interview with W.S. three months following her facelift surgery. • Did you experience any fear before

your surgery?

No, I would say that I had very little fear, if any. I recall having slept totally comfortably the night before. In fact, I had a photograph taken of me when we were leaving for the doctors' office, and I was smiling and looked very relaxed.

surgery before going through with it?

I had it on my agenda for about two years. I was looking for a time frame which was much longer than what I actually needed, and I had to juggle some other things in my life.


· Was the procedure itself painful?

No, I didn't feel anything. I really don't recall a thing about it.

· What was your recovery like?

I think that my recovery was phenomenal. I had the surgery on a Tuesday and we had a family party the following Sunday. I will admit that it was in a kind of controlled light, evening situation. But my daughter, who is a young woman, didn't notice anything, so I think that's a pretty good indication. By seven days, I was totally, totally functional. I had a little bit of concern about sleeping in a balanced way. I would sleep on my back. And then, after I slept on my left side, I would try to sleep the same amount on my right side. Other than that, I would say that I had barely any discomfort. I had






#### **Implant Placement** Procedure

1. Dental implants can support a fixed bridge, eliminating the need for a removable partial denture.







#### **Getting the Color Right**

Have you ever seen someone with a cap or crown on their front tooth and could tell from a mile away that it doesn't match their other teeth? Until just recently, dentists had to use little colored shade tabs and try to figure out what color porcelain the dental laboratory should use when making their new crown. Unfortunately, this left a lot up to the interpretation of the dentist or assistant and often times, it was wrong. Teeth appear to be all one color but actually have multiple bands and layers of different colors. Communicating these subtle nuances to the lab was

virtually impossible. Often times, the patient had to visit the lab so the technician could attempt to match the porcelain of a new crown to the rest of the patient's teeth.

Now there is a new technology called ShadeVision. The system works with the same technology that matches paint color. The ShadeVision scanner is placed over the tooth and records color data. That data is e-mailed to the dental laboratory, and they use it to make a perfectly matched crown. They can even scan the crown they made and check it against the measurements provided by the dentist. This technology eliminates the guesswork and provides the patient with a well-matched, natural-looking crown.





## A Major Exhibition of Paintings by Francis Bacon

During the 1950s, painter Francis Bacon began to formulate the iconography of his dark and troubled world in paint. The exhibition, "Francis Bacon in the 1950s," opening at the Milwaukee Art Museum, Jan. 27 through April 15, 2007, features nearly 50 paintings from the period in which Bacon was at the height of his creative powers. In this intensely fertile time, many of Bacon's themes-screaming popes, howling dogs, and haunting figures trapped in tortured isolation-began to materialize as the man himself was becoming one of the most significant artists of the 20th century.

"Francis Bacon in the 1950s" takes a profoundly personal look at this fascinating period in Bacon's career and is the first exhibition to examine Bacon's formative works. Curated by Michael Peppiatt, a close friend of Bacon's, the exhibition provides a first-person perspective on the artist's emerging style in the first decades of his career through paintings, drawings, and a selection of archival materials that illustrate the artist's life and work.

At the core of the exhibition are 13 paintings collected by Sir Robert and Lady Sainsbury, who were among the artist's earliest patrons and, eventually, close friends. The works include loans from public and private collections across the world, a number of which have rarely been seen in public.

This unique opportunity to view exceptional works by Bacon is credited to a new partner of the Milwaukee Art Museum, the global financial services firm UBS.

"The usual feeling you get in a Bacon show is of tortured, strangled human beings alone in a room," explained Peppiatt. "These paintings have a much more narrative quality, a much more approachable Bacon, of sorts. Someone who hadn't decided who he was going to be, someone still in search of himself.

By the 1950s, Bacon had acquired sufficient technical prowess as a painter and expressed his often dark vision with force, but he was not fully in command of his disturbing images. Eager to explore themes

and take risks in his early career, Bacon created images that contain a rawness and sense of urgency that would be lost in his later works.

To Peppiatt, the '50s seemed to hold a lot of the clues to who Bacon was: "That was when he located his biggest themes. He felt that he had to focus on the most important things of all to man... his ex-

Bacon is one of the most unique and powerful artistic visionaries of postwar European art. The 1950s were the most fruitful years in Bacon's career, but they were also the most tumultuous and tortured of the artist's existence. During this time, the artist was regularly without a fixed address, borrowing rooms and changing studios with incredible frequency. The artist established a pattern of allnight revelry, culminating in a feverish fit of creativity-painting into the early morning hours. Much like Bacon's approach to life, his approach to the canvas was radical, aggressive, and seething with raw human emotion.







#### Spider Veins... Varicose Veins... What is the Difference?

Roughly, 30 percent to 60 percent of the decol® is the only medication currently type of vein problem. Varicose veins are veins. The procedure is done in the office enlarged, bulging veins in the legs that often cause pain and swelling. An article in last month's Barrington Lifestyles focused on the treatment of large varicose veins using endovenous laser ablation. While spider veins generally do not represent a significant health problem, they can be quite cosmetically disfiguring. Spider veins generally do not cause any physical symptoms; however, some people experience an aching or burning sensation around the veins, especially with prolonged sitting or standing.

Small varicose veins and spider veins sclerotherapy. Sclerotherapy involves injecting a medication into the vein to make it shrink and eventually disappear. Sotra-

general population is affected with some approved by the FDA for treating spider and requires no anesthesia. Patients report very little if any discomfort, generally describing it as a very slight pinching sensation. After treatment, the treated leg(s) should be elevated for a few hours and compression stockings are worn for a few days. There is almost no disruption to daily routines following sclerotherapy. Treatment takes several sessions of sclerotherapy in most cases and results are not immediate. It takes several weeks for veins to begin to disappear, and full benefit is seen after several months.

> Small varicose veins can also be eliminated through a procedure called microphlebectomy. During microphlebectomy, a tiny incision is made in the skin and the varicose vein is actually removed. The procedure is done with local anesthesia and no stitches are needed. Patients are required to wear compression stockings for a few days after the procedure and good results are generally immediate.



A new player in the marketing against the drug counterculture is Family Interactive Drug testing (FIDT), a start-up, notfor-profit public charity. It's founders intend to arm all parents of teenagers with free immediate-detection technology for use as a deterrent in the most effective environment, the home. Parents' determination in the home can be voiced confidentially and sincerely, with all of the consequences of choosing drug use, openly discussed.


Government research concludes that the parent is the most effective "anti-drug." Parent "anti-drug" momentum is greatly enhanced when each parent knows that other parent-neighbors are, at the same time, addressing drug use with their children. Parents have the right to remove all doubt and a need to know. "All children have a basic need for approval from their parents," the psychologists say, although it may be masked by adolescent behavior at times. Not all acting out is due to adolescent phases and it could be because of drug use. There is only one way to tell. The lines of communication between teens and parents are still in tact if you call in your "emotional markers" in the right

social drugs all at once. It is a simple urine test with an indicator if the sample has been contaminated. The results are within minutes and highly conclusive. These types of tests are extensively used for preemployment screening and random employee drug testing in commerce and industry. Random drug testing is here to stay. FIDT is confident that most parents will want the on-the-spot ability to test for assurance. FIDT deterrent programs are based on random drug testing at-home, at the discretion of parents, fully informed in advance, on how to apply the testing as a deterrent.

This is not a school district program. No school money is used and school districts aren't informed of, or liable for, the results of tests administered by parents. Children refusing to cooperate with parents in testing raise the suspicion of drug use and that in itself can be a timely indication for increased parental attention, if not professional intervention. Funding for FIDT community projects come from community businesses and community oriented individuals as well as government grants obtained by FIDT. Funds from a community go back to that community.
