





# **Art Associates to View Matisse Exhibition**

This artist's early work was not well accepted by the critics or by the public. His paintings were criticized for their strong emotions and his use of wild and often dissonant colors. Critic Camille Mauclair wrote: "A pot of paint has been flung in the face of the public..." In 1913, his controversial painting Nu bleu was burned in effigy at the Armory Show in Chicago. In the succeeding decades, however, his work engendered more positive responses and today Henri Matisse (1869-1954) is regarded as one of the three seminal artists of the 20th century.

This spring, the Art Institute of Chicago (AIC) is hosting a special exhibition entitled "Matisse and the Methods of Modern Construction." Members of the Barrington Northwest Community Associates (B/ NWCA) will have the opportunity to view the exhibit and to learn about the monumental career of Henri Matisse on Monday, April 19 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The AIC/CSO Joint Education Seminar is an annual event consis- tently regarded as a highlight of the entire B/NWCA season. This year's focus on the critical time period identified as the development of Modernism is certain to exceed expectations. Co-sponsored by Stephanie D'Alessandro, curator of the Matisse exhibit at the AIC, and by Gerard McBumey, "Beyond the Score" creative director for the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, this semi-

During this time Matisse produced some of his most experimental and enigmatic works, a period Matisse himself later called "pivotal" for his career. Bathers by the River, a centerpiece of the exhibition, demonstrates a style that is abstracted and purged of descriptive detail, geometric, and dominated by the colors black and gray. However, Modernism was not just dominated by artists; composers were also following a new path, utilizing lean construction and irregular forms. # **Medication Prevents Claim Under** the Americans With Disabilities Act

The Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) applies where an employee suffers from a permanent disability as a result of an injury or illness. An individual with a disability is a person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. A qualified employee with a disability is an individual who, with or without reasonable accommodation, can perform the essential functions of the job in question. A reasonable accommodation may include, but is not limited to, making existing facilities used by employees readily accessible to



and usable by persons with disabilities, job restructuring, modifying work schedules or reassignment to a vacant position.

Recently, an Illinois Federal Court addressed the issue of whether a flight attendant whose depression is controlled by medication has a disability as defined by federal employment law. The lawsuit alleged that the employer violated the ADA when it denied the employee's request for intermittent medical leave and then terminated her for unapproved absences from work. The ADA defines a disability as a physical or mental impairment "that substantially limits one or more major life activities." The nature of the limitation is not considered with reference to a specific job, but in light of what most people do in their daily lives. The Court found that the plaintiff could not establish that her depression constituted a disability since an individual's condition as it exists after corrective or mitigating measures are used to combat the impairment is considered when determining whether that individual is disabled. In the plaintiff's case, medication enabled her to perform tasks that the average person can perform since the plaintiff admitted that when she is on her medication, her depression did not inter-tion.

fere with her ability to travel, clean her house, use a computer or participate in other physical activities. Significantly, she admitted that when on medication her depression did not prevent her from working. The court found that her testimony leaves no doubt she is able to perform the tasks central to most people's life which is fatal to her claim that she is disabled within the meaning of the ADA.



I try to review as many of the new technologies as I can in these monthly articles. Dentists are constantly bombarded with fliers, salesmen and periodicals that show off these technologies. It is up to the dentist to sift through the hype and understand the true benefits for his patients. This month, I would like to review digi-

No more individual films inside your mouth. Just placing a small sensor in place of the film allows the dentist to take X-rays that are instantly displayed on a computer screen. The benefits are numerous in this type of digital system. The radiation used is decreased by 75 percent, and the images yield better quality information than regular film. You can magnify them, rotate them or make them color. No chemicals are used for developing, which saves the environment. The patient and dentist can view the X-ray together, because it's up on a large computer screen.

This technology has been out for years,

but the initial images were not as detailed as the regular X-ray film. Recent improvements in imaging software have made it possible for these digital systems to give greater detail than the old films. Even the American Dental Association has given their approval, which was denied in past years because of the image quality.

Because of their benefits to patients, digital X-rays will slowly make their way into all dental offices. Until then, you will only find it in a small percentage of practices that have the computer network support in their facilities to take digital Xrays. Ask your dentist when he plans to incorporate it into his practice. When you see this new technology in action, you'll understand what I mean.

# Dr. James Baird Addresses Common Foot Problems

If foot or ankle pains are getting in the way of your life, it is time to find the help you need. Dr. James Baird, Board Certified Podiatric Physician and Surgeon, is now accepting new patients in his Barrington office. Below are Dr. Baird's answers to some common foot and ankle questions.

I recently woke up during the night with extreme pain in my big toe joint. I do not remember any trauma, but even the pressure of the bed sheets caused me pain. What could this be and is there anything that can cure the pain quickly?

You are most likely suffering from a case of gout. Gout is a condition where a normal by-product of the body, uric acid, accumulates in the big toe joint. This accumulation of uric acid causes swelling, redness and extreme pain. A gout attack can be stimulated by a small trauma, dehydration, or certain foods or medications may bring an attack on.

An acute case of gout is best treated by a podiatrist. We will rule out other possible causes for the pain and swelling and once it is confirmed to be gout we will start you on an oral medication which will relieve the pain in 12 to 24 hours. After the gout has resolved, we will do a simple blood test to determine the cause of the attack. Long-term treatment incorporates changes in diet and sometimes a need for tion with Dr. Baird. a gout medication on a daily basis.

While working out last week I twisted my ankle. I did not think much of it then but now, seven days later, the ankle is tender and very swollen. Is this an injury that needs treatment?

Everyday over 25,000 people experience an ankle sprain, which is an injury to the ligaments of the ankle. Hopefully you have been treating your sprain with rest, ice and elevation. Since the pain and swelling have been present for more than three days, you should be evaluated by a

In our office we will go through a full exam of the various ankle ligaments and perform an X-ray to look for a fracture. We have the ability to take X-rays in the office so we can review the results with you at your appointment. If there is no fracture, we will proceed with the treatment of the ankle sprain which will consist of splinting of the ankle, a regimen to control the swelling and pain, followed by physical therapy and continued bracing while returning to activity.
