Protecting Your Legal Rights—The Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act

The Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act provides that an employer is required to pay "final compensation" at the time of separation, if possible, but in no case later than the next regularly scheduled payday. Final payment includes all "wages" which are defined as any compensation owed an employee pursuant to an employment contract or employment policy. Generally, final compensation under the act includes earned wages, salaries, commissions, severance agreements, bonuses and vacation pay. 



With regard to vacation pay, where the company has a policy that provides for vacation pay, all earned but unused vacation time is required to be paid to the employee even if the employee resigns or is terminated. Moreover, the act provides that no employment policy shall provide for the forfeiture of earned vacation time upon separation. In order to preserve your rights, a written demand for payment should be made in the amount owed before filing suit. If the company fails to comply, than a complaint should be filed with the Illinois Department of Labor or in state court for the unpaid amounts. Damages under the act include all unpaid amounts, attorney's fees, costs, interest and statutory penalties.

minated should be aware that earned wages as defined by the act are required under Illinois law without regard to whether you release your legal rights against the company. As such, if you are requested to sign a release, you should carefully review the agreement with counsel to determine your legal rights under both Illinois and federal laws. This analysis is necessary to determine whether you are being adequately compensated for the release of your legal rights. What Age is Best for Certain Procedures? by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Patients often ask at what age it is best to get certain procedures done. This will vary from patient to patient, but there are some general guidelines that apply in most cases. Ultimately, only the patient along with their surgeon can determine if a certain procedure is right for them or if the timing is appropriate.

Evelid Rejuvenation

Most people will notice the aging process first around their eyes. Some puffiness beneath the eyelids, especially in the morning, will get more and more noticeable. This can create a tired look even when the person is well rested. Although some people will notice this in their twenties, this usually becomes more apparent in the thirties and forties. Although both upper and lower eyelids may age simultaneously, some people will notice only one or the other aging sooner.

Fine lines will begin to appear around the eyes in the late twenties or early thirties. These can be treated with light chemical peeling or the newer glycolic acid creams at home.

Facial Rejuvenation-Facelifting

Facial rejuvenation involves a number of different procedures. The most common is facelifting. Facelifting improves jowling and looseness of the neck through incisions around the ears. This procedure is rarely done on patients in their thirties. Most patients are in their forties and older. It is common to perform facelifting at the same time as eyelid rejuvenation.

Facial Rejuvenation-Forehead Lifting

A forehead lift allows the brows to be elevated as well as the frown lines smoothed. This is done through an incision behind the hairline. Although some patients may have low lying brows in their thirties, most do not seek forehead lifting until their forties. It is common to perform forehead lifting along with a facelift.

Chemical peeling is designed to smooth the skin. A number of new light and medium depth chemical peels have become available for younger patients with early, fine lines. Patients in their twenties may undergo light chemical peeling. The more sun damage there has been to the skin, the deeper the lines will be and the deeper the chemical peel needed to affect them.

Rhinoplasty

Rhinoplasty or nasal recontouring is commonly performed on teenagers and young adults though older patients are candidates as well. The younger patients typically seek a smaller, more attractive nose than the one they were born with. Older patients, however, may notice signs of aging in the appearance of their noses. The tip of the nose tends to droop with age. Simply elevating the tip will give the aging patient a younger look.

The decision to undergo any surgical procedure is not taken lightly. Only a fully informed patient can make such a decision. The best time to undergo a particular procedure is when that procedure will result in a noticeable improvement in whatever features are undesirable to the patient. If no change will be apparent, it may be best to wait. These issues are addressed fully during the consultation. This is the best way for a patient to become fully informed.

Dental Technology: Part I

New technology, new techniques and new materials constantly challenge the dental profession. Sorting these out and selecting the best is a consistent endeavor for any quality dentist. The question "Will this yield a better result for my patient?" is the best measuring stick to use when determining whether or not to include some new technology in a dental practice. Over the next few months, I will review some of these new technologies and give you my opinion of how they measure up.

Much of the newest technology is presented to the dental profession before it's truly ready. To compensate for its inadequacies, the manufacturers try to sell their product from a marketing standpoint instead of a practical one. An excellent example of this is the dental laser drill. What a dream come true for a patient! No drilling sound and the decay just gets "zapped" away. These laser dental drills are available today, but they fall way short in practicality. They can be used to "zap" decay, but the dentist still has to use a standard drill to shape the tooth to accept a filling. The laser cannot remove an old filling, cut off an old crown, shape teeth for porcelain veneers or even smooth a biting surface. Where is the advantage in that? I have been told by some of these manufacturers that if I buy one, I should really market it so that I attract new patients even though I wouldn't really use it. They told me, "People love lasers!" But benefit his bottom line. I realized this wasn't going to give my patients a better result, so I passed.

A laser technology that does benefit the patient is used in an instrument called the Diagnodent. Every day, dentists perform exams and miss decay on their patient's teeth. This decay is usually in deep grooves where the dentist cannot reach with his dental pick. The decay can grow in size and go undetected, even from X-rays. A new instrument called the Diagnodent changes all of this. A laser is aimed into these deep grooves and, if tooth decay is present, the instrument will detect it. The dentist can then clean out the decay and place what is usually a substantially smaller filling than he would of if he waited for detection with the pick.

Lasers are certainly a benefit to all those in the dental field, including patients. They will probably be a part of all the new technologies in our future. Be certain that your dentist is using new technologies to benefit you and not as a marketing tool to
