Protecting Your Legal Rights— Illinois Enacts Equal Pay Act

by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

This summer, the State of Illinois enacted the Illinois Equal Pay Act of 2003 (IEPA). The act is virtually identical to the provisions found in the Federal Equal Employment Pay Act (EPA), which makes it illegal to pay a member of one gender different wages than those paid to a member of the opposite sex for the same or similar work on jobs which require equal skill, effort and responsibilities. Under the Illinois act, any action to collect wages must be brought within three years of the underpayment. Under the EPA, a legal (or three years in the case of willful vio complaint must be filed within two years lations) of the alleged sex-based under-


The Illinois act also contains a provision that protects employees from discrimination and retaliation. For instance, an employer may not discharge or discriminate against an employee for pursuing rights under the act. An employee may file an action against an employer with the Illinois Department of Labor or file a civil action to recover the amount of underpayment, interest, costs and attorney's fees. Legal remedies for violations of the EPA include back pay in the amount of the total lost earnings in terms of the earnings the employee would have received had the act not been violated. Phyllis Schlafly Visits McHenry County to Speak Against ERA

The Second Annual Liberty of Life Dinner sponsored by the Pro-Life Victory PAC of McHenry County was held Sunday, November 2, 2003 at Boulder Ridge Country Club, Lake in the Hills, IL. This dinner is a fund raiser for the PAC. Funds are used to promote pro-life candidates. It was a tremendous success.

Phyllis Schlafly, President of Eagle Forum (www.eagleforum.org), the featured guest speaker, gave a riveting speech against passage of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA). Mrs. Schlafly has been a national leader of the conservative movement since 1964 and has been a leader of the pro-family movement since 1972, when she started her national volunteer organization, now called Eagle Forum. The ERA may be considered for a vote in the Illinois Senate this week during the fall veto session. The ERA has already passed the Illinois House. Mrs. Schlafly reminded us that ERA has nothing to do with authentic women's rights, and our Constitution already contains gender neutral wording to protect women's rights under the law. She began her speech by stating, "In ten years of debate, ERA advocates were never able to show that it would give any benefit to women. ERA doesn't even mention women—the word used in ERA is "sex." The U.S. Constitution is completely sex-neutral; it uses only sex-neutral words such as "we the people," "citizen," "person," "resident," "Senator," "Representative."

The passage of the ERA will victimize women and children by transferring state law to the federal government. The following is just a few of the negative effects if this law passes: 1) Invalidate state laws that require a husband to support his wife, while women will become equally liable for their husband's debts. 2) Wipe out the presumption of alimony or child support for divorced women. 3) Force women to register for the military draft and be equally assigned to all combat positions in the military. 4) Take away the rights of widows to receive Social Security benefits based on their husband's earnings. 5) Write abortion rights into the constitution forcing tax payer funded abortions (which the majority of Americans oppose). 6) Force all organizations to be fully coeducational and sex-integrated. Think Title IX mischief. 7) Prevent insurance companies from charging lower rates to women

Topinka Tells Governor "Put Away the Credit Card"

Illinois Budget Continues to Unravel

Sighting his intention to borrow an additional \$1 billion, Illinois State Treasurer Judy Baar Topinka has once again urged the governor to put a lid on spending and make the tough choices necessary to put our fiscal house in order.

"These desperate actions clearly point to a budget coming apart at the seams,"

According to documentation from the Office of Management and Budget, the governor's office is proposing the issuance of nearly \$1 billion in general obligation

Traditionally, bonding has been for capital improvements and infrastructure needs," said Topinka. "The governor's bonding plan reflects dangerous trends toward pushing off today's debt on tomorrow's taxpayers.'

A part of the bonding will be used to refund nearly \$300 million in existing bonds to enable the state to make fewer

payments in 2004. The refunding pushes out maturities of the refunded bonds into the future to provide short-term budget-

"This method of borrowing is extremely backloaded with only a fraction of the debt being paid back over the next 10 years," said Topinka. "It's disturbing to see that our children and our grandchildren will be saddled with this debt for generations

"I agreed to borrow \$1.5 billion last spring, based on assurance that we would not continue this cycle. It now appears that the governor plans to borrow, in part, to cover the payments of the last borrow-

"I am sure that in the short term, this additional borrowing will help to fill the gaping holes in our current budget. But in the long run, it causes great damage to the fiscal health of our state.'

Let's Be Honest

I decided to write this article because our office is bombarded daily with calls about whatever the latest and greatest new thing was on television the night before. We all get excited about new innovations, especially if we can truly benefit from them. But the consumer needs truth, not hype.

Cosmetic surgical procedures and treatments have never been more popular or acceptable in the general population. More and more physicians are performing cosmetic procedures, as insurance reimbursements for most medical procedures go down and the demand for these cosmetic services go up. This trend continues even into some salons where there are no true medical personnel.

The demand for easier, less invasive procedures fuels a huge industry that sells expensive technologies to the physicians or salons who, in turn, promote them to the consumer. This would all be fine if these new technologies delivered what they promised, but all too often they don't. There are ads and stories on the nightly news proclaiming the newest procedure or treatment that promises to give you the result of a facelift, for example, with no downtime and no recovery. Common sense alone would tell you that this cannot be. If it sounds too good to be true,

The truth: there is no replacement, at this time, for well-done surgery. Do some of these noninvasive treatments work? Yes, but rarely to the degree that is claimed. The "before and after" pictures in brochures and ads are the very best results that have been collected from across the nation. They rarely represent the typical or even obtainable result. Physicians need to be honest about what results to expect in the typical patient.

only after being accepted by the medical community were they introduced to the public. Today, that sequence has been hijacked. The market is so competitive, with new technologies introduced almost every day, that they are often promoted to the popular media and the public before they are subjected to a rigorous medical review. So if a company can get a public frenzy going about their product, it will force sales to physicians even if their product is unproven.

So how does the consumer sort through all this? Don't believe every claim just because it is reported on television. Consult with a trustworthy physician, one who has been around in an established cosmetic practice. If a physician with no prior experience decides to break into the cosmetic market by buying some new technology, be cautious. Don't believe that any noninvasive technology can accomplish what can be achieved through surgery. That is just hype. Give newer technologies time to prove themselves. If they work and are effective, they will stand the test of time. There are many exciting advances being made with great promise for the future. 

Barrington Woman's Club Celebrates 90 Years

This year, the Barrington Woman's Club will celebrate 90 years of providing support to local philanthropic, cultural and civic projects in the Barrington commu-

In 1914, a small group of women formed this cultural organization and set out to establish the first library in Barrington. The first year, they procured 1,000 books, which were circulated free of charge from William J. Cameron's drugstore. As the library increased its collection, its site was moved several times to new locations. The Barrington Woman's Club managed, staffed and supported the operation until the village and its first library board took it over in 1926.

The club has continued to support the library throughout the years. In addition, a scholarship committee was formed in 1931 to give loans to college students. In 1965, awards were given rather than loans. Presently, the club awards \$24,000 in scholarships annually. Last year, 13 Barrington area charities and service organizations received a total \$7,000.

Among the organizations that received donations from the club last year were: Barrington Area Library, Barrington Historical Society, Barrington Senior Citizens,

Parents ask this question on a regular basis when flossing is suggested as part of their child's oral hygiene routine. The answer is always the same—yes!

When a child's primary (baby) teeth grow into their mouth, there are always spaces between them. These spaces, especially in the back (molar) area, close as children get older. Once these spaces are closed, a toothbrush bristle can't break through the tight contacts between the teeth. Food can become caught in these areas, remain undisturbed for a long period of time, and allow the cavity process to begin. "What? Do they really have to floss? I begin are on the sides, in between these teeth. A toothbrush can effectively clean the tongue and cheek sides of a tooth as well as the chewing surface. But the only way to help prevent the most common of the childhood cavities is the use of floss.

The flossing procedure need only involve the passing of the floss through the contact areas to break up food debris. For children below the age of 9, this is best accomplished with parents' help. Most children above 9 can usually do this effectively on their own.





The Eyebrows

The appearance of the forehead and upper face play a fundamental role in our overall appearance and affect how others perceive our inner emotional state. The forehead region is intimately associated with expressions of sadness, fatigue, fear, anger and surprise. Interestingly, the natural aging process that occurs in the forehead and upper face closely mimics these same expressions. Unfortunately, the changes that occur as the forehead and upper face age are some of the earliest signs of facial aging overall and occur to a point where they begin to negatively impact our interactions with other people as we no longer look the way we feel.

"Gravitational and degenerative aging occur in the forehead and upper face just as it does in the mid- and lower face and do so at an early stage. Why this is so frequently overlooked remains a mystery to me, because the signs are so obvious yet easily corrected," says aesthetic plastic surgeon Greg M. The position of our eyebrows is maintained by a delicate balance between two muscle groups located in the forehead region. One group lowers or depresses the eyebrows while the other group raises or elevates the eyebrows. The depressor group is the more powerful muscle group and is the main cause of eyebrow descent or ptosis. Because of their repetitive action, the eyebrows are lowered to an unwanted position; the upper eyelids appear puffy as the eyelid crease becomes obscured; a fold of skin begins to form over the outer portion of the upper eyelid; unnatural horizontal, vertical and oblique furrows and creases form between


Sorting Through Dental Technology: by James T. Gavrilos, DDS Part IV

Over the last three months, I discussed how new technology, new techniques and new materials constantly challenge the dental profession. Sorting these out and selecting the best is a perpetual endeavor for any quality dentist. I discussed the advantages and disadvantages that lasers, digital X-rays and shade matching systems have brought to the dental profession. This month, I would like to review metal-free restorations.

Ever notice someone with a crown or cap on his or her tooth and a dark gray area at the gumline? This gray area results from metal that is underneath the porcelain. For over 20 years, dental ceramic manufacturers have marketed metal-free crowns to dentists. But the problem has always been durability. The metal-free crowns fractured easily and did not fit on the prepared tooth as well.

Now there is a new system called Pro-





cera that cures these problems. Instead of having a metal support, the crown has a white cast support that is as strong as metal. Not only is it white, but it also has translucency. This allows light to shine through the crown in the same manner as it shines through a natural tooth. The crowns can be made with the same strength as the ones with metal and no ugly gray areas result.

If you have any crowns that have a dark gray area at the gumline, ask your dentist if you are a candidate for having it replaced with a Procera crown. You'll have one new reason to smile.





Art Associates Special Valentine's Program

Named after St. Valentine, a priest in Rome during the third century who was executed on Feb. 14 for preaching Christianity, Saint Valentine's Day is a time to exchange tokens of love and friendship.

Letters, poems, songs and expensive gifts have expressed love throughout the centuries. The oldest paper valentine, written in 1415, is kept in the British Museum. The first printed valentines appeared around 1800. By 1815, when the cost of mailing a letter in the same town dropped to a penny, Feb. 14 became one of the busiest days for the post office. The loveliest valentines were made between 1840 and 1860 when Queen Victoria ruled Great Britain.

On Jan. 15, 2004, the annual luncheon and lecture of the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago will feature "Love's Messenger, Valentines in the Victorian Era."

Paper lace, hand-painted birds, hearts or flowers, and carefully handwritten verses enhanced the beauty of Victorian valentines. Famous Victorian valentine makers Jonathan King and his wife, Clarissa, produced expensive valentines. The King Co. had a special room where customers could select their valentines in private. English artists Catherine "Kate" Greenaway and Walter Crane designed valentines for Marcus Ward and Company. Choosing and sending valentines in Victorian England allowed men and women to express romantic feelings they rarely uttered out loud.

Debra N. Mancoff will use examples from the Art Institute's extensive collection to reveal "Love's Messenger." Debra is the author of Treasures from the Art Institute of Chicago. 



The Eyebrows

the depressor group to lower the eyebrows. Unfortunately, its muscle activity comes with a price; the unwanted longer horizontal creases that form across the upper two-thirds of the forehead. These deep wrinkles result from a conscious or unconscious effort to lift the descended brow skin off of our eyelids, raise our eyebrows to their more natural position and clear the obstructing skin from our lateral fields of vision. Anatomically, these visible wrinkles form when the connections of the underlying forehead muscles to the overlying forehead skin are tight-

ened when the muscles contract. The browlift or forehead lift procedure is designed to arrest and reverse signs of the aging process in the forehead region while providing a more complete and harmonious rejuvenation of the face. An older method of browlifting, called the open or coronal browlift, was performed by cutting the scalp from ear to ear, physically peeling the scalp down off the skull and removing portions of the scalp in an effort the raise the eyebrows. Many patients were unhappy for several reasons: recovery time could be long; patients were left with a permanent large incision that was unacceptably noticeable to them and their hairstylists; their hairline was now in an unnaturally high position; many experienced temporary or permanent hair loss



scopic or limited-incision browlift procedure, is performed by aesthetic plastic surgeon Gregory M. Bazell, M.D., at The Aesthetic Plastic Surgery Center of Barrington. With the use of specialized instruments and a very small surgical camera (called an endoscope), this technique involves giving the entire forehead region a smooth appearance, getting rid of all the forehead wrinkles, eliminating the outer upper eyelid skin overhang while uncovering the natural upper eyelid crease, surgically removing the unwanted depressor muscle group and restoring the eyebrows to their normal location thereby leaving them with a natural appearance. The surgical incisions are less than a half an inch long and follow the direction of the hair follicles so they are virtually undetectable. No scalp tissue is removed so that the hairline position is not changed and hair loss does not occur. This technique allows for the precise shaping of the eyebrows so that unnatural appearances and shapes can be avoided.

"I think the fear that people have when presented with the prospect of a forehead lift are the misconceptions that it is an extensive procedure with a long recovery time and that they will be left with an unnatural look," states Dr. Bazell. patient satisfaction is very high. They love your fingers. looking happier, brighter, less tired while still looking like the younger versions of themselves. I talk to a lot of hairstylists who are equally impressed with the natural appearance of the results and the near imperceptibility of the incision.'

The endoscopic browlift procedure is an outpatient procedure performed under local anesthesia with a small amount of intravenous sedation. It can be performed alone or in combination with other aesthetic plastic surgery procedures, most commonly upper eyelid surgery (blepharoplasty). The procedure itself usually takes only one to one-and-a-half hours to complete. Swelling and bruising are minimal. And most patients take very few pain pills following the procedure; in many cases, patients take none at all.






