Barrington Takes "Great Strides" **Towards a Cure for Cystic Fibrosis** \$80,000 Local Goal for Research!

On Sunday, May 17, Barrington area residents will lace up their walking shoes and pound the pavement towards a cure for cystic fibrosis (CF) at the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation's 3rd annual Great Strides Walk-A-Thon, being held at Citizen's Park in

Barrington.

Participants are raising money to benefit the more than 1,000 families in the Chicago metropolitan area who are waging a daily battle with CF, the most common life-threatening genetic disease in the United States, affecting 30,000 children and adults. In addition, more than 10 million Americans are genetic carriers.

Great Strides is the CF Foundation's largest national event. This fundraising program, now in its 21st year, raised nearly \$37 million in 2008 to support and carry out its lifesaving programs. Nearly 90 cents of every dollar of revenue raised by the CF Foundation is available for investment in vital CF programs to support research. care and education. The foundation recently achieved a coveted 4-star rating for sound fiscal management from Charity Navigator, the largest charity evaluator in

With the support of the CF Foundation, there has been tremendous progress in cystic fibrosis research and care. The me-

Art Associates to Tour Milwaukee Churches

Louis Comfort Tiffany (1848-1933) was an interior designer who in 1878 opened his own studio and glass foundry to produce the special types of glass he desired to complement his interior decorations. Based on Roman and Syrian glass features he had admired on an earlier trip to England, he sought to create stained glass which would incorporate vibrant colors and textures. Tiffany achieved his goal by experimenting with many different types of glass and eventually created artistic treasures that became the focal point of any room they were designed for.

Louis Tiffany became the most famous stained glass artist in the United States and members of the Barrington/Northwest Community Associates will have the opportunity to admire some of these masterpieces on Thursday, May 21. For the last excursion of the season, Bill Hinchliffwill conduct a daylong (8 a.m. to 4 p.m.) tour of magnificent stained glass and architecture examples in Milwaukee, Wis.

The tour will begin with the city's grandest church, the Basilica of St. Josaphat, which has one of the most ornate interiors in the U.S. and has recently been stunningly restored. The fine pictorial German glass is just one of many decorative elements. The next site will be St. Paul's Episcopal Church near downtown Milwaukee, famous for its remarkable collection of Tiffany windows, perhaps the finest in the Midwest. St. Paul's also has examples of Victorian, Neo-medieval and English glass, which offers a fascinating contrast with the Tiffany. After lunch at to Milwaukee should satisfy all current



the wonderful Lake Park Bistro overlooking Lake Michigan, the tour will continue to a small, country-like church, the Plymouth Congregational, whose windows are all by Tiffany. This unpretentious jewel includes one of the most beautiful stained glass windows the Tiffany studio ever produced, which fills the west wall of the church. Finally, the tour ends at the Church of the Gesu, which serves Marquette University. Inspired by the great Gothic-style church at Chartres, Gesu has an amazing collection of German (Zettler) windows, including two of the largest in



New COBRA Regulations Under the Stimulus Plan

On Feb. 17, 2009, President Barack Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, commonly called the Stimulus Plan. Group coverage continuation laws require employers to offer employees who lose group coverage the opportunity to continue their employer-based health insurance. COBRA is the federal law that requires employers with 20+ employees to provide group continuation coverage. State law requires employers of any size to provide group continuation coverage. of the amount that the individual would otherwise pay for COBRA coverage from March 1, 2009 forward. Unemployed workers will be required to pay the remaining 35 percent of the cost of their COBRA coverage. The provisions apply to most unemployed workers who are or have been involuntarily terminated between September 1, 2008 and December 31, 2009. The subsidy is not available to workers whose income in the year they receive the subsidy exceeds \$125,000 for individuals and \$250,000 for couples filing joint tax returns. The COBRA premium subsidy will generally be available to individuals for nine months, but not longer than the period of COBRA coverage, which is generally 18 months from the date of the involuntary termination of employment. The subsidy will be cut off

for coverage under Medicare or another major medical group health plan. An individual is subject to a penalty if he or she fails to notify the group health plan of the new health care coverage.

A Gray Area

One of the greatest challenges in dentistry is finding materials that can withstand the forces generated in the mouth. In the past, gold has been the material that combined biocompatibility with strength. It is still the standard by which all new materials are measured.

But what do we do when we have to crown a front tooth? Decades ago, gold was used on the front teeth. But as you can imagine, their appearance was far experiment with different plastics and porcelains to cover the gold and create a crown that was white in appearance. This is the system that is most frequently used today when making tooth-colored crowns. The drawback to this system has always been the opacity of the crown. Light cannot be transmitted through the restoration because of the gold substructure, and this resulted in teeth that looked like Chiclets. Another problem is the appearance of this gold at the gumline. When someone smiles and you see a gray area at the margin where the crown ends and the gums begin, you're looking at unpolished gold that appears to be gray. In some instances, this grayness will radiate into the gum tissue because the metal used under the porcelain was not gold but a cheaper substitute. The molecules of the cheaper metal are leached into the gum tissue creating a gray tattoo.

Over the past 20 years, dental technology has introduced many different white substructures in order to eliminate the by James T. Gavrilos, DDS



from satisfactory. Technicians started to gray appearance and the opacity. Unfortunately, many of them have fallen short on the durability scale and resulted in fractured porcelain. That is, until now. A company from Europe produces a white substructure that is just as strong as gold without the undesirable appearance. The substructure is fabricated in a central lab using digitized information e-mailed to them using the dentist's impression. The substructure then has porcelain applied to it just like the gold ones do. The result is a natural-looking crown that doesn't show any gray at the gumline.

Your eye are itchy, red and irritated. You have what has been termed as "pinkeye." "Pinkeye" is of course a layman's term for viral, bacterial or even allergic conjunctivitis. Conjunctivitis happens when the conjunctiva, which is a thin membrane that lines the eyelid and part of the eyeball, gets inflamed and irritated then causes a pink or red color to appear on the normally white part of the eye.

Because conjunctivitis can be caused by a number of different factors, it is necessary to be seen by an optometrist. Only an optometrist can test for which type of "pinkeye" you suffer from, and ultimately provide proper treatment. Even if someone in your house had "pinkeye" in the past, never use drops or solutions that were not prescribed for you. Just because the symptoms are the same, that doesn't mean the treatment will be. You could be making your condition worse by selfmedicating. Also, don't try to grin and bear it. Left untreated, conjunctivitis could lead to keratitis, an infection of the cornea that can result in vision loss.

Protect Your Ash Trees

rived in our area. This invasive beetle is responsible for killing approximately 50 million ash trees in neighboring states. Confirmed cases of EAB infestation have been detected in many of our neighboring towns. If you have ash trees, taking a proactive approach to protect them now could save you the high cost of removal and replacement later.

Background—EAB is native to Asia and is believed to have hitchhiked here in wood packing crates. Young EAB's feed inside ash trees disrupting the tree's ability to transport vital water and nutrients, ultimately killing the tree.

Symptoms—Visual signs of EAB infestation usually go unnoticed for 1 to 3 years and once they are apparent it is usually too late to save the tree. Visual signs can be yellowing of foliage, thinning of canopy, shoots sprouting from the trunk, branch dieback and death.


Invasiveness—EAB spread so fast through Michigan that it left 40 million dead ash trees in its path in just six years. On July 1, 2008, a single tree was discovered in Algonquin, Ill., that was infested with EAB. Within one month, 42 trees in three different nearby areas were destroyed, as they were found to be infested as well. Officials believe that the first ash tree was infested for approximately five years before EAB was noticed. Although there have been no confirmed cases in Barrington, experts believe EAB is prob-

The Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) has ar- ably already here and trees have just not shown any symptoms yet

> Recent Breakthroughs-Luckily for Illinois residents, a chemical control known as TREEage was approved for use last April. TREEage has proven to be highly effective at controlling EAB when it is injected into the trunk of the tree. Studies at Michigan State University found that injections of TREEage were 99% to 100% effective on EAB. Single treatments of TREEage were also found to give longterm protection, lasting approximately two years inside the tree.

> Take action now-Don't make the mistake of waiting until your ash trees start to show symptoms, as it will probably be too late to save the tree. The Illinois Department of Agriculture and many municipalities have the right to force private homeowners to cut down their ash trees at their own expense if they find EAB or suspect that a tree has






