 at so high a rate as to be nearly or quite
 prohibitive rendering the employment
 of capital for trade manufactures or
 improvements of any kind extra

hazardous and

whereas there seems to be a feeling amounting almost to a demand that something should be done in the near future to afford protection therefore

Resolved That R. Clark and H. C. Sandman be appointed a special committee to investigate and report to this board at its next regular meeting the best plan or plans including water supply.

And Be it Further Resolved.

That said committee be instructed and requested to make this investigation thorough and exhaustive. To investigate and all plans that may come to their knowledge or to which their attention may be called to the end that the Board may have accurate information upon which to base future action.

And be it further Resolved

That said committee be authorized to expend time and money sufficient to enable them to carry out the full intent and meaning of these resolutions.
