The committee appointed at last meeting to confer with the Electric Light Co made the following report.

To the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington:

Your committee respectfully report and recommend that they find it to the best interest of the Village that a contract be made with the Barrington Electric Company to pump the supply of water for this village for a term of years at the rate of \$75⁰⁰ per month for a maximum volume of water up to 18,000,000 gallons per year and at the rate of 5 cents per 1000 gallons above such maximum amount. Provided, the Village does not have to employ an extra man to supervise the water system. They further recommend that the Electric Light Co be permitted to occupy the unused portion of the engine and boiler room in the basement of the Village hall for the purpose of placing their motor and pump or pumps and connecting with the present supply pipes and well pipes by suitable valve connections to be so arranged that the pumps of the village can be connected by reversing the valve connections.  Gentlemen:

I herewith submit to you a final report of my acts and doings as attorney for the Village of Barrington.

Upon my appointment I at once took personal charge of all legal matters in which the village was interested. My attention was first turned to the suit known as the "Station street case", which had been pending in Court for several years. It was not long before I had secured an agreement of all parties interested whereby the case was settled amicably and with full protection to the rights of the Village. During my term of office I have disposed of twenty-three cases and it is with gratification that I am able to report that all were won by the village. Besides attending to these cases I have, in performance of my duties been called upon to draw up a large number of orders, ordinances, and opinions, the legality of which has never been questioned. In the special assessment for water mains, I was

over!

Obliged to make new and complete forms for Court proceedings, as our special assessment case for laying water mains was one of the first cases started in Court under the new law. The satisfaction given by these forms is shown by the fact that many attorneys, representing municipal corporations, have since made use of them. During my term of office the village has been put to no expense in any matter for Special Counsel, as none has been employed. There are only two cases now pending upon the docket, in which the village is interested: Meyer vs. The Village of Barrington Et al, and Parker vs. The Village of Barrington Et al. Much of the evidence for the defence in these cases has already been prepared, such as the survey and view of ground in question and depositions of a number of witnesses. All this I have turned over to my successor. Now, that my term of office is ended and I am relieved from further responsibility, I wish to thank you for the honor you have bestowed upon me and the confidence you have placed in me."
