On the matternof the side-walk and curb on No Cook Street at the premises of the Greengard Grill, Wewetzer reported that the following agreement had been made; The property owner is to pay for one-third of the cost of new side-walk, the Tenant to pay for one-third and the Village to pay one-third, and the Village to pay for the entire cost of curb.

Motion was made by Kocher seconded by Owens that the Cpuncil approve this agreement. Motion Carried.
