Blanke reported for committee investigating sewer conditions

as to rectifying same. The matter was turned over to the committee
with power to act.

Owens reported that progress was being made in the matter of
the connection of the Jewl Tea water mains with the City mains.

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Motion made by Kocher second by Owens, carried on vote of the
council, the Call Statements of the Harris Trust and Savings Bank
of Chicago and the First National Bank of Barrington, were accepted
and ordered placed on file.

The police committee was instructed to investigate license
tags or stickers for Autos, Motorcycles and dogs for the year 1943.

A resolution was passed on motion by Berg second by Kocher to
request the amount of \$ 103.00 additional from the State Highway
Department for the repair of the intersection at Russell and
Summit Streets.

The Clerk was instructed to ask local coal dealers for
bids on 35 tons of stoker coal and conditions of delivery.

Mr Cummings appeared at the meeting regarding the amount he
was being charged for sewer service at his home on Northwest Highway.
The matter was placed in the hands of the sewer committee for a
report.

Mr Maloney, Village Attourney, reported that he had written
to Mr Burandt asking his intentions regarding his resuming his
duties as Village Clerk. He stated that he had received a reply from
Mr Burandt to the effect that due to unforeseen circumstances
he would be unable to return to Barrington and asked that proper
form be mailed him to sign for resigning from the clerkship.

Mr Maloney reported that such papers had been mailed to Mr Burandt.

Mr Kocher made motion that the council meet on Monday evening July 27 to act on the appointmen of a Clerk to fill vacancy, provided the resignation of Mr Burandt was received in the interim. Motion was seconded by Owens and carried on vote of the council.

Mr Maloney was instructed to prepare Tax Levy for 1943 to be presented at the next regular meeting.

Mayor Hatje stated that the doors on the sewer plant were in bad shape and should be replaced. The matter was left with the sewer committee with power to act.

Action was taken through ~~motion~~ common consent of the entire Council to allow Nicolai and Behrens the amount of \$ 30.00 per week while on vacation.

Meeting adjourned, to meet again Monday evening July 27 on motion by Owens with second by Sutfin, and carried by vote of the council.

August 3, 1942

Meeting was called to order by the President, Earl Hatje at 8:05 P.M.

The following members answered present at roll call; Kocher, Blanke, Wewetzer, Owens and Sutfin. Berg Absent.

The minutes of the meeting of July 20 and the adjourned meeting of July 27 1942 were approved on motion by Kocher with second by Wewetzer. Motion carried

Blanke reported that the installation of the cement floor in the garage had been completed at the cost of \$ 52.00.

Blanke reported that the committee recommended that Mr Cummings of North West Highway be refunded the amount of \$ 10.00 which he had been overcharged for sewer service inasmuch as the second floor had not been completed and he should not have been charged sewer service for a two-family dwelling. On motion of Blanke seconded by Owens this was carried by vote of the council. The sewer charge for this property henceforth is to be \$ 25.00 per year for two-family residence.

The matter of the Hoerneke basement was left in the hands of the committee for further action.

Wewetzer reported that the committee having charge of the matter of low sidewalks at the Hans property had been unable to do anything up to date.

The question arose regarding the cation of Police Officer Smith, whether to allow him two weeks or confine it to one week.

On motion by Owens with second by Kocher it was passed by the following vote of the council to allow him two weeks

Inasmuch as it will be impossible to obtain metal license plates this year for the Village tags, the motion was made by Kocher, with second by Sutfin that stickers be purchased for the year 1943. Motion carried by following vote;

Included in the above motion was the purchase of Fiber Tags for the use of dog owners.

Bids having been received from local dealers for the supply of coal for 1942, and the fact being that the Barrington Coal Co were the low bidders, motion was made by Blanke with second by Wewetzer that the coal supply for 1942-43 be purchased from them. Motion Carried. The price quoted was \$ 6.50 per ton for Stoker Coal

Included in the above motion it was agreed to leave the amount to be purchased at any one time to the Building Committee.

Mr Arthur Weiner, Auditor for the Charles J Anderson Co then read the annual auditors report. On motion of Kocher with second by Blanke the report was accented as read. Motion carried.

The matter of the \$ 229.00 due the Village from the Clsoed State Bank of Barrington, through Mr A.C.Burandt, was brought to the attention of the Council. The matter was left in the hands of Village Attorney Malonry to take up with Mr Burandt for settlement.

The meeting was called to order by President Hatje at nine o'clock P.M., November 2, 1942. The following members answered present at roll-call; Kocher Blanke Wewetzer Owens and Sutfin.

The minutes of the meeting of October 19 1942 were approved as presented to each member in writing by the Clerk. Motion was made by Kocher with second by Wewetzer and carried by vote of member present.

Mr Blanke brought up the matter of an individual installing plumbing fixtures in his own home and asked if permit was required and if it was legal for the person to do his own work even though he was not a Plumber. It was agreed that he must obtain a permit to ~~xxx~~ install them but could do his own work provided he complied with the proper methods of installation.

The matter of the change of property of the Gold Star Building to Mr Edward Gieske and the remodeling of same and the future use to which it was to be put. The application for building permit was presented showing rough sketch of work to be done but it was agreed that a drawing drawn to scale was necessary before issuing permit. Also detailed specifications were to be supplied by the contractor.

Regarding the use of the building it was agreed that the building could be used for a cleaning establishment as Mr Gieske stated that there would be no more than 5 persons working in the plant. This cleaning plant is to be in conjunction with the present laundry.

Mr Howard Bringlinger was present and informed the Board that Mr Wallace had resigned as Treasurer of the Library Board and that Mrs Ruth Butler Foresberg had been appointed to fill vacancy.

Blanke reported that he had sent a message to Mr W A Steward of 136 Raymond Ave, by Mr Purcell, for Steward to cease operations on his building at once, but that there had been no word from Mr Steward to date regarding the matter.

Blanke recommended that the ordinance be enforced and that action be taken against Steward. Motion was made to that effect by Blanke with second by Kocher, and motion was carried by vote of members present.

Owens reported that Mr Purcell had gone over all motors belonging to the Village with a Mr Lavine of the Hartford Insurance Co and that he, Mr Owens, was going to take the matter up with Wirt Lawrence regarding the coverage of the Insurance policy.

It was also mentioned that it might be well to investigate the possibility of obtaining a Blanket Policy covering all insurance for the Village.

The insurance policy covering accident to Firemen expires on November 8th and Mr Donald Schroeder presented a new policy for consideration. The matter was shown Mr David B Maloney for his consideration and upon his finding the policy in good order as to coverage it was voted to place the insurance with Mr Schroeder, motion to this effect was made by Owens with second by Sutfin and carried by vote.

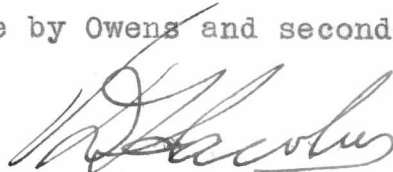

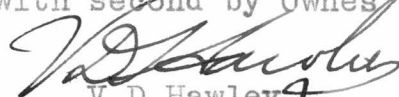

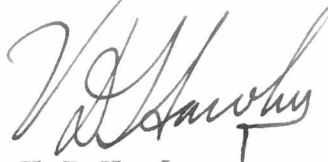
