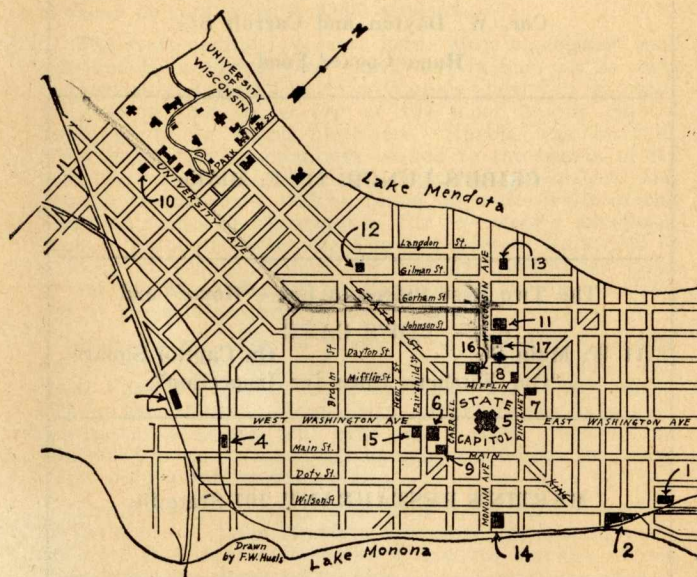

Madison is a city of 65,000 people. It is the home of a great university with 9,000 students.

The state capitol is located here. May we suggest that you find time during your short stay in our city to visit the capitol and have a uniformed guide show you its beauties. It is said to be one of the most unique capital buildings to be found anywhere. Marble was brought from many foreign countries to add to the charm of its architecture. Mural paintings, depicting the history and growth of our state, will be found upon the walls of the different rooms of the capitol. The Governor's Reception room is patterned after the Doge's Palace in Italy, and is a thing of beauty. There are regularly conducted trips by uniformed guides at regular hours. Be sure to take one of these trips through the capitol.

Madison has over 30 parks. You should, if possible, find time to enjoy some of these while you are here. The Vilas Park zoo is said to be the finest zoo in any small city in the country. Here every animal family is found. Annie, the elephant, will give you a royal welcome, as well as the newly acquired camels, including the baby camel only a few months old.

The University Campus of over 1,000 acres, nestling on the shore of Lake Mendota, is a spot you should wander over at leisure and enjoy. There are marked Indian Mounds on the Observatory Hill.
