

The homegrown software allowed us to provide lists of silent auction winners, by table number, for our guests, Express Check-Out receipts, itemized receipts for all event winnings for guests to use for tax purposes, reports to quickly pull silent auction items for winners during the show and

more. Ultimately, it provided our guests with a better checkout experience. Internally, it helped us track and reconcile our event numbers easier and faster! We now have a free and reusable software package we can pull-out from year to year, event to event. The true benefit of implementing a new facet such as this is the ultimate strengthening of our brand: BJWC. And as any of you marketing gurus out there know, there is great value in doing so. A value perception of such an experience creates an awareness within our guest audience, associating BJWC with professionalism and modern savvy. Those are the perceptions that help keep our contributors re-
