Let's Talk Teeth: Should Regular Dental Exams Be So Regular?

The idea of "getting your teeth cleaned every six months" is obsolete. In my office the interval for scheduled dental cleanings may vary from two months to one year depending on my patients' needs.

Cleaning needs are determined by a thorough oral examination of the periodontal structures (gums, bones, ligaments) which support your teeth. X-rays are taken and crevace or sulcus measurements around each tooth are recorded on the patient's chart. An individual's medical status such as diabetes or pregnancy is considered, and a treatment plan is proposed.

For pregnant women or individuals with some degree of gum disease, a three month dental cleaning interval is usually recommended. Multiple studies have shown significant improvement of teeth and gums if cleanings are performed at three month (or more frequent) intervals.

For a few people with very good luck or special oral hygiene efforts, a one year appointment is sufficient. Most patients' schedules, however, fall somewhere in be-

These simple dental tips can aid in your overall dental health between appointments:

· Brush thoroughly once a day with a fluoride toothpaste

- · Use a toothbrush with a soft rounded bristle and replace it every three months
- · Floss your teeth carefully once a day
- · Eat a balanced diet
- Don't smoke or chew tobacco
- · Avoid constant sipping of coffee, tea or soft drinks
- Avoid chewing ice, biting pens, cracking popcorn kernels
- · Wear a mouthguard when you play







Teaching Your Child Techniques For Learning And Remembering

mined not only by intelligence, but also by the methods or strategies that they use to master all the new facts, ideas and concepts that they must learn. Children need strategies because effective learning requires their active participation.

According to Dr. Raymond J. Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, there are five effective strategies you can teach your children for active learning:

1. Asking questions. Self questioning forces the student to think about the material in order to answer the questions. When listening to lectures or reading textbooks, it is helpful for students to think about the topic and make up some questions that will focus their attention and improve concen-

2. Making inferences. Making inferences involves thinking about the information, ideas or opinions we hear or read about, and trying to draw conclusions from this new information. Learners must think about the material, thus making it more meaningful and easier to remember.

3. Creating analogies. You can help children create analogies by encouraging them to relate things they know to the new information by looking for similarities or making comparisons. Creating analogies is a way of building temporary mental bridges between what is known and new informa-

4. Finding the main idea. New information whether in class or in textbooks, usually

How well children do in school is deter- includes a number of main ideas or facts and a lot of material to support them. As students read or listen, they must often ask themselves, "What's the point here?" If students constantly look for the main idea, they will be concentrating on the important material, and will be actively involved while studying.

5. Categorizing information. When we have many items of information to learn, it helps to group them into categories. All items in a category must have one or more similar characteristics. For example, in science class, animals are divided into groups such as reptiles, mammals, fish, etc. It makes the learning task more manageable by breaking it into smaller parts.

You can help your children succeed in school by talking to them about these five different learning and memory strategies and making sure they understand and are able to use them. But even motivated learners who pay attention to their school work may continue to have difficulty. This could be an indication of a weakness in basic


I can't believe we are approaching our 11th anniversary this summer at Wickstrom Ford. Tim and I feel extremely blessed that we have so many long term employees.



Nine-To-Five Dog

Dogs thrive on routine: walk, play, feed, train, owner leaves for work, hang around the house, owner arrives home, walk, play, feed, train, hang around with owner, walk sleep, etc. Once they know the routine, they expect it. Changes in routine means trouble. Anticipation can cause problems. Dogs who are normally well behaved can fall apart if you go out in the evening after being away all day.

own, without physical or mental stimulation, a dog can develop stereotypical routines. Just like a caged wolf in a zoo, it might pace relentlessly or it might run up and down the stairs, bark incessantly, or even urinate and defecate in the house. Separation anxiety and this kind of obsessive behavior occur most frequently in dogs rescued from animal shelters or animals with an inadequate exercise routine.

Most dogs get worked up at the sign of your departure or your arrival home. Canine extroverts behave in a relentlessly gregarious way, but so do highly strung or neurotic individuals. Prolong boredom can also induce over excitement. The tendency to be excitable is partly inherited and partly learned. Excitement is a gratifying feeling. It acts as its own reward, which is one of the reasons dogs behave this way.
