Blown Glass With A Twist


Chesterfield Gallery at the Barrington Ice House is currently featuring an exhibition of blown glass sculptures by Chicago artist Eric Bladholm.







Prague, Czech Republic

Three opera houses grace Prague today, and each symbolizes a different part of this city's colorful though sometimes painful past. Since the first performance 368 years ago, opera has played an important role in the life of Prague and been entwined in its history and politics as well.

The neo-Renaissance National Theater, which opened its door on November 18, 1883, stands on the right bank of the Vltava (Moldau) River like a cornerstone of the city. Smetana wrote Libuse, a most politically effective opera which deals with the legendary founder of Prague and emphasizes the historic achievements of the Czech nations, for the premiere performance. Because of him, almost every

This is the first in a series of articles on fa- Czech composer from the home-loving Dvorak to the expatriate Marinu, has tried his hand at opera and found a place on the theater's stage.

The Prague State Opera was originally named the New German Theater in 1888 when it opened with Die Meistersinger. It remained a distinguished and progressive German theater until Prague's German community itself disappeared with World War II. For a while it was renamed the Smetana Theater, the irony of which the composer's music had long been excluded from the house in favor of German works earlier in its history.

The third and oldest opera house is now called the Tyl Theater. Built in 1783 as the Estates Theater, later named the Royal Provincial Theater, it was renamed in 1945 to honor the nineteenth-century playwright J. K. Tyl. It was in this theater that Mozart conducted the world premiere of Don Giovanni in 1787, and La Clemenza di Tito

With these three opera houses, and with the smaller New Stage, an experimental theater next to the National that presents plays, chamber operas and children's shows, Prague has kept its place among the world's opera capitals.



Can A Picture Bring A "Cease Fire" Between You And Your Stylist

Most stylists will agree that a picture is a good beginning to a mutually satisfying experience at the salon. For both men and women the language of hair can be elusive at best. Words like Fring, Layers, Length, are subjective terms, meaning "they can mean something different to everyone." Why then even when we scour through books for the perfect look, do we often achieve less than expected results?

It might be because of lack of skill on the part of the stylist, but the inability of either you or your stylist to interpret what you are really seeing and compare it to your own resources will play a large part in any failure to meet expectations. Here are some of the misconceptions that can lead to less than optimum results.

• The finished look of the picture is the result of styling (blow drying, setting, curling, etc.) rather than a precise haircut. Having several pictures can alleviate this problem, as you can compare the differences and see how they are achieved.

• The Texture (body, density, curl) is nothing like your own. Try to look at the hair texture in the photo before picking the style.

 The models bone structure and features are nothing like your own. A solution for this is to use the pictures as guidelines and discuss your own features with your stylist regarding your choices (a great way to make sure they really see you!)

· The picture is really achieved through special effects (wind, lighting, mood, movement) and does not demonstrate a good cut or functional style. Many photos in ads depict a moment in time rather than a design that can be duplicated



Workshop Teaches Strategies To Conquer "Homework Battles"

Research has shown that homework affects a student's achievement in school. The child who consistently does his homework will perform better academically than the child who does not. Doing homework also teaches children responsibility. When a teacher gives an assignment, it is up to the student to bring the assignment home, do it accurately, take the work back to school and turn it in. Parents need to reinforce the importance of taking this responsibility.

Homework also allows parents to have day-to-day contact with their child's education. A parent's motivation, interest and support are crucial for their child to do well

In "Homework: A Parent's Survival Guide," a lecture presented by Huntington Learning Centers, Dr. Raymond J. Huntington, president and founder of the tutoring company, has identified seven common homework problems among students:

- 1. Puts forth minimal effort; work is sloppy and full of mistakes
- 2. Refuses to do homework
- 3. Fails to bring assignments home
- 4. Takes all night to finish homework: easily distracted, daydreams often, or needs constant help
- 5. Refuses to do homework on his ownneeds constant assistance from parents
- 6. Waits until last minute to finish assignments
- 7. Will not do homework if parents are not home

To learn to do homework on their own, students may need to break a large assignment down into small steps. This is also a good way to plan long-term projects, so that all the work is not left until the last minute. Use a small notebook to keep track of daily assignments.

Parents have a tremendous influence on a student's self esteem, and can show encouragement by praising their student's efforts. "The 3 C's"—showing care, concern and communicating is the best way to enforce good study habits.

Getting homework done responsibly takes work. Children need a proper study area, a designated homework time, genuine support and encouragement, and commitment from parents that homework is a priority in the home. By teaching children basic organizational skills and good homework habits, parents can give their children the tools necessary to make wise choices about school work. Students will learn that they can deal with homework successfully and will soon feel better about themselves. Replacing Missing Teeth

There are several ways that a dentist can replace missing teeth.

A void where teeth have been lost may be filled with lifelike, custom made replacement teeth which are attached to crowns made for the teeth on each side of the space. To make these crowns, the dentist prepares the teeth by removing their enamel. Next, an impression of the prepared teeth is made and sent to a dental laboratory. The laboratory custom makes the crowns and replacement teeth and returns the results to the dentist to place in the patient's mouth. The prosthesis is called a fixed bridge because it may not be removed by the patient.

In many instances missing teeth may be replaced using dental implants. Implants are really artificial tooth roots to which the dentist fastens a custom make crown. This crown may replace a single missing tooth, however, more commonly implants are used to support a fixed bridge when there are no natural teeth on each side of the space to be restored.

Barrington Residents Invited To Choose Village Hall Design

Residents of Barrington will soon have their chance to take up a pen and become an architectural design expert, at least for the moment it takes them to mark the design ballot found in the Special Edition Village Report mailed to village homes on Oct. 20.



Buildings, Sites and Facilities Subcommittee Chairman Robert Woodsome came up with the idea to hold a design competition of sorts, as a way to involve residents in the project of providing Barrington with a new Village Hall. Not only will the exer- designed to create a quiet statement that

cise increase public awareness of the proposed project, which comes before the public for financial approval on Election Day, Nov. 7, but it allows residents the opportunity to "have a say" in how their village will look in future years.

Williams Associates, architectural firm

chosen by the Village for the Municipal Facilities Project, submitted nine alternative designs for the proposed Village Hall. These designs were developed through an in-house competition at Williams Associates and, upon submission, were then juried by an architectural

review panel made up of local architects. This panel was jointly chaired by Harry Burroughs and Linda Grubb, and included Bob Coffin of Coffin & Scherschel, Bill Gardner of Gardner Roach & Welch, and

Ron Flubacker.

They in turn decided upon three designs which now are presented to the public in anticipation of residents' interest and enjoyment in being part of choosing the exterior of the proposed new Village Hall. Ballots are only available in the special edition of the Village Report, and they must be completed and returned to Village Hall by Nov. 6.

The two most popular designs, based upon the vote of the people, will be presented to the Village Board following the Nov. 7 election. Results will be made known regardless of the referendum out-

Design Notes

Each of the proposed new Village Hall designs is based on the master plan which includes a two-story office space accommodating the daily operations of the village departments, linked by a brightly illuminated two-story atrium to the vaulted ceiling, single story public meeting rooms. Architecturally, each design shares similar ele- 842-5050.

The Haeger Potteries, Craftsman For 125 Years

In this, their 125th year, Haeger Potteries visitor to the exposition saw. This was the heritage with a visit to the Haeger Museum, located in the Haeger Potteries.

The history of Haeger Potteries spans 125 years full of traditions within the Haeger family, the Haeger business, and the Dundee Township growth. To visit Haeger Potteries Factory Outlet, participate in a factory tour and view items displayed in the museum is entertaining and educational for young and old alike.

Within the showcases of the Haeger Museum are pottery pieces of memorabilia. One of the oldest ceramic pottery pieces is a green ceramic drinking cup. 





Barrington Area Historical Society's Christmas Ornaments

In keeping with the Barrington Area Historical Society's annual tradition of creating unique and collectible ornaments for the Christmas season, the Society will present three very special ornaments for the 1995 holiday season.

The 1995 solid pewter selection features the second of the four Hough Street Schools. None of us in the Barrington area today can remember what the original two room frame structured Hough Street School looked like when it was built in 1854 much less the north, south and center wings that were added in 1883 to produce the school which is featured on the BAHS's pewter ornament. But when it was dismantled in 1905 to make room for the new brick school it was divided into four sections.





According to Ruth Munson, BAHS Board Member, all four sections became private residencies. One of these homes was later moved to North Avenue where it still stands as the Greenery Restaurant. The oldest 1855 section was destroyed when the Public Safety Building was constructed. But thanks to local artist, Liz DeWitt, the structure in its entirety can again be seen on the handcast pewter ornament being offered by the Barrington Area Historical Society.
