

BAAC is grateful to the Cook and Station Street merchants as well as the Village of Barrington for supporting our objective of bringing quality art and a festival of fun to the people of the Barrington area, at no charge.

The Barrington Area Historical Society will be hosting its annual "Doorways Through the Decades Home and Garden Tour" on Sunday, June 30, 1995. This year the Historical Society has expanded its tour to include the gardens of the five lovely homes it will be featuring on its walk.

Included on the tour this year is the Barrington Hills home that was once the hunting lodge of the Pullman family. Moviegoers will be able to see the gracious old world charm of this home on the big screen this year. Its interior and exterior were used in the soon to be released Hollywood movie, "Chain Reaction" starring Keanu Reeves.

As a special treat, the historical society will be conveying guests by bright yellow school buses to what was once a one room schoolhouse. Through extensive renovation, the present owner has created a light and airy modern home that captures the original school's unique interior architecture.

Another home which began as a modest cape cod in the village has gone through some dramatic remodeling by its current owners to emerge as an elegantly designed and decorated home. Its vaulted yellow kitchen and spacious soft blue living room will be featured on the pages of a national design magazine this season as well as on our tour.

Another village home on the tour exudes the charm and interests of its resident artist. Each room is bursting with unusual antiques, hand painted tiles and artwork, luscious plants, and groupings of collectibles. Dental Care And Heart Conditions

It is usually impossible to perform dental treatment (even basic cleanings), without causing some minor bleeding which allows bacteria from the mouth to enter the bloodstream. In a healthy patient there is little problem, but in people with cardiac abnormalities the bacteria may inflame the heart valves or heart tissue causing a serious and often fatal disease, bacterial endocarditis.

Fortunately, the problem can usually be prevented by taking antibiotics prescribed by your dentist in accordance with guidelines developed by the American Heart Association. These antibiotics are generally taken only on the day of the procedure, but they must be taken in prescribed doses at specific times.

Persons with poor oral hygiene have chronic periodontal (gum) disease with large numbers of dangerous bacteria present in their mouths at all times. If these individuals also have heart abnormalities they may be at risk even without having dental

Lifetime Planning While You Are Healthy

Recently, I have been involved in a case where it was necessary to have a guardian appointed by the court. The process is laborious, time consuming and expensive. With proper planning, everyone can avoid the unnecessary expense of time and money of court appointed guardianship.

An elderly woman, in her nineties fell and was rushed to the hospital where it was determined that she needed surgery. Her only relative was a distant cousin. The woman was incoherent and unable to understand the complexities of her situation. The doctors could not treat her without proper authorization. Since the woman could not authorize her own treatment, the doctors suggested that she have a guardian appointed by the courts. This process took months to accomplish. Because medical procedures could not be performed without proper authorization, she was transferred to a nursing home until a guardian could be appointed.

A guardian is a person appointed by a court of law, after a full court proceeding, to manage the financial and personal affairs if it is determined that a person is no longer able to adequately manage their affairs. guardian ad litem to interview the person Usually, a family member petitions the

and determine whether the petition is correct. When the hearing takes place in court, the person has a right to be present and generally testimony from doctors is also required to verify that mental capacity has been diminished.


Court appointed guardians can be family members or friends, but the decision as to who will be appointed is ultimately up to the judge who presides over the case. In some cases, the judge might even appoint a bank, an attorney, or the county social service agency to act as guardian. Once the guardian has been appointed the guardian controls the person's affairs to the extent of the guardian's authority.

You can prevent the court appointed tially a contract between you and another control over your life.

person of your choice by which you give the other person the legal authority to gain access to your financial affairs. Powers of attorney can only be created when you have the mental ability to know what the creation of the contract means, and you are acting at your own free will. A durable power of attorney remains valid even if you no longer can direct your agent and supervise her actions. Only you can create a power of attorney for you. Thus, if you never had given a power of attorney and you became unable to manage your affairs because of an illness that affected your mental powers, the option would be unavailable to you.

Antiques In Country Setting

Approximately 65 dealers will be represented at the Racine Antiques Fair, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. June 30 at the Racine County Fairgrounds in Union Grove, Wis.

Tucked away in the rolling farm country of southeastern Wisconsin, the town of Union Grove provides a gentle, country atmosphere for the show, where lovers of antiques and fine collectibles will find a wide range of items evoking the images of yesteryear.

At the May show, for example, Indian Hill Antiques of Grayslake featured duck decoys and boxes of turn-of-the-century apothecary bottles found at a warehouse auction in Chicago. Indian Hill also presented an iron tool box from the mid-1800s that was used to hold firefighting tools and that fit into a slot on fire wagons. Manufactured by the H. Reynolds & Col. of Poplar Ridge, NY and called the "Cayuga Chief, Jr.," it was 14 inches long and 5 inches wide. And, just to prove how diverse their interests are, dealers Peter and Mary McCabe also featured majolica, including a German cake plate and a matching serving plate in a pretty, hard-to-find shade of pink with gold trim.

Beaumont House was back with several collections of turn-of-the-century quarter sawn oak furniture. Dealer Fawna Radewan featured a beautiful library table with drawer and lower shelf, original hardware and gracefully curved legs; a Morris chair with great lion head arms and reupholstered cushions; and a buffet server with curved glass ends for display, three drawers, claw feet and original brass hardware.

Antiques, Fox Point, WI, brought lots of blue-flow blue, blue willow, art pottery and primitives-plus pink and gold Haviland, sterling and collectible silver plate flatware (lots of grape) and wonderful Victorian jewelry. Filut also featured a signed, all-metal Pairpoint table lamp (1890-1920), with metal shade in the shape of a flower, and a pair of framed New York Central Railroad prints dating back to 1928 and 1930.

Remaining dates for the 1996 season of the Racine Antiques Fair are August 11 and September 15.






