




The Octagon House was built by Richard Peacon, a grocer, in 1899. The home was once owned by interior designer Angelo Donghia, who purchased it in 1974 for \$45,000. Donghia spent over \$100,000 renovating and redecorating it. The house was then sold to fashion designer Calvin Klein for nearly one million dollars in 1980. This was the highest price ever paid for a house in Key West at the time. Klein sold it several years later for much less.

This home was built in 1855 by John Lowe Jr. Lowe's father made his fortune as a wrecker and owned a fleet of sponge and lumber ships.

This is the best example of a Bahamian-influenced home on the island. Built of heart of pine and Honduras mahogany, it is joined by wooden pegs. The mortise-andtenon joints give the home strength and "give" during tropical storms. The widow's walk allows residents a view of both the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf of Mexico.



THE HOUSES OF KEY WEST



hen traveling, I always enjoy learning about the people who live in that particular location and their "houses." To study the special flavor each area has, to investigate who started building the community and as to how they acquired their wealth is fascinating. Key West definitely has great allure!

Key West, located 50 miles south of Miami and ninety miles north of Cuba, is only four miles long and one mile wide and almost completely surrounded by coral reef, making it a "wrecker's paradise."

Early settlers of the 19th century included New England seafarers who took advantage of salvaging cargo off the reefs. Sponging and turtling were also thriving businesses about this same time. Bahamian wreckers were also attracted to the area as well as fisherman. Many Cubans fled to Key West due to Spanish dominance around 1831 and consequently the cigar industry prospered.

As these various industries flourished, houses began being built, reflecting the heritage of the dwellers, all contributing greatly to the charm and intimate atmosphere of Key West.

The Milton Curry Mansion was built by the son of the island's first self-made millionaire, a wrecker. Neoclassical in design, the 26-room home is now a guest house.



This is an example of an "eyebrow house." There are about 30 examples of these houses in Key West and do not exist anywhere else in Florida. The roof eaves extend well below the top of the facade, shading the upper story of the house. It catches cool breezes and sends them inside the home. Surprisingly, the rooms receive plenty of indirect sunlight during the day. Shutters close against the direct heat of the sun.




This modest one story clapboard home was once owned by Thomas Lanier Williams, better known as "Tennessee" Williams. Williams enjoyed the remoteness of the island, allowing him time to write. The Bahamian home was his from 1949-1983. The Rose Tatoo, which he received a Pulitzer Prize for, was written in this house. He also worked here on Summer and Smoke. The furnishings were old wicker he brought over from Cuba.

Owner George Roberts moved to Key West from the Bahamas. This is the island's most outstanding example of Queen Anne styling. The double wrap around Queen Anne and Victorian styles came to Key West in the late 1800's from England. The gingerbread trim gives a formal house a "playful" appearance.



The Albury House, built after 1850, offers a New England style widow's walk. This house's features includes typical conch features: wraparound porches, attic window vents and many eclectic details. Of interest: when the U.S. law specified that salvaged cargo from shipwrecks in American waters be brought to the nearest domestic port, the wrecking industry in Key West economy was given a boost! Many wreckers from the Bahamas relocated in Key West, bringing with them their own architectural style: louvered doors, roof hatches for ventilation, ceiling fans and tin roofs.







The South of France

What better way to spend a few weeks this fall than meandering through the small villages of Provence, or exploring the seaside villages from Menton to St. Tropez.

Start your journey from the small elegant village of Menton, near the Italian border, made famous by Winston Churchill who spent many delightful sojourns sipping Pol Roger champagne during his wartime years as Prime Minister. Wind your way along the Base Corniche, the small coastal road, trying your hand at the Casino of Monte Carlo. Explore the many small fishing villages of Villefranche, Cap Ferrat. Spend a night in Beaulieu at the Hotel La Reserve de Beaulieu. They do not build hotels like this anymore, so serene, and


Climb the summit of the small village of Eze to the Jardin Exotique for spectacular views along the Mediterranean coast. Aftowns of Nice and Cannes, staying perhaps at the legendary Negresco in Nice, or the Hotel Majestic in Cannes, meander inland towards Provence, stopping first for coffee in the town of Grasse, lured here by its fabulous perfume. Allow yourself to be captivated by the charm of St. Paul de Vence with its superb landscapes which inspired Miro, Chagall and Matisse. Head towards Haute Provence or high Provence, following the Route Napoleon marched on his return to Paris.



A wonderful town to explore in Provence is Aix-en-Provence, birthplace of Cezanne. Here you will find the Mount of Saint Victoire which he painted so ofter you have explored the obligatory ten; you must climb it, the view is magical. It's from Aix-en-Provence that we discover the rich and varied antiques trail that winds its way through bucolic Provence. This month I will discuss how the IRS made things easier for business selection by the new "Check-the-Box" regulations that became effective in January 1997.

Under the new rules, the old four factor test: i.e. whether a business entity has limited liability, free transferability of interests, centralized management and unlimited life, will no longer matter. Now, new limited partnerships consisting of two or more owners will be automatically taxed as partnerships unless they affirmatively elect to be taxed as corporations. Single owner entities, such as solely owned LLC's, will be treated as sole proprietorships for tax purposes unless they too affirmatively elect to be treated as corporations.

No special election is necessary for eligible business entities that wish to be taxed as partnerships. Noncorporate entitreated as sole proprietorships. However, if these entities wish to be treated as cor-8832 (Entity Classification Election). The tax at the shareholder level. form must include all the information required and the entity's EIN. The form create a positive environment for taxpayshould then be attached to the entity's federal tax return to eliminate the entity from becoming subject to penalties.

More than federal income tax law needs legislation in the near future. to be considered in choosing the entity for a new business. Other considerations in-



clude creditor protection, state tax laws, employment taxes and expenses.



How to Choose a Dance School for Your Child

Many parents of young children who desire to take dance lessons find themselves unsure as to how to choose a school. Frankly, a recommendation from a neighbor or friend is not enough. Tuition—Do some comparison shopping as to class rates. Classes should be competitively priced but one should not think that the cheapest class means more for your money. As with everything, quality costs more. Schools should have discounted tuition for multiple classes if your child is a serious student. Family discounts may also be available.

Even pre-schoolers taking lessons should have a fun, interesting and beneficial class. A little extra time will result in a decision that you and your child will be happy with for years to come!

Teaching Your Child Techniques for Learning and Remembering

How well children do in school is deter- usually includes a number of main ideas mined not only by intelligence, but also or facts and a lot of material to support by the methods or strategies that they use them. As students read or listen, they to master all the new facts, ideas and concepts that they must learn. Children need strategies because effective learning requires their active participation.

According to Dr. Raymond J. Huntington, founder and president of Huntington **Learning Centers**, there are five effective strategies you can teach your children for

1. Asking questions. Self-questioning forces the student to think about the material in order to answer the questions. When listening to lectures or reading textbooks, it is helpful for students to think about the topic and make up some questions that will focus their attention and improve concentration.

2. Making inferences. Making inferences involves thinking about the information, ideas or opinions we hear or read about, and trying to draw conclusions from this new information. Learners must think about the material, thus making it more meaningful and easier to remember.

3. Creating analogies. You can help children create analogies by encouraging them to relate things they know to the new information by looking for similarities or making comparisons. Creating analogies is a way of building temporary mental bridges between what is known and new information.

5. Categorizing information. When we have many items of information to learn, it helps to group them into categories. All items in a category must have one or more similar characteristics. For example, in science class, animals are divided into groups such as reptiles, mammals, fish, etc. It makes the learning task more manageable by breaking it into smaller parts.

You can help your children succeed in school by talking to them about these five different learning and memory strategies and making sure they understand and are able to use them. But even motivated learners who pay attention to their school work may continue to have difficulty. This could be an indication of a weakness in basic skills

Assisted Care Facilities for Seniors

Illinois counties have the authority to those senior citizens who need some limbuild and operate assisted living facilities for persons 55 years of age or older, according to an opinion issued this week by Attorney General Jim Ryan.

"Although counties have not been granted the express authority to operate an assisted living facility," Ryan writes in the official opinion requested by the Mercer County State's Attorney, "a county may operate such a facility pursuant to its power to establish and maintain a home for aged if residency in the facility is limited to persons who are at least fifty-five years of age and who are infirm or chronically ill."

ited assistance but are not in need of 24-hour care.

Counties clearly possess the authority to operate long-term-care facilities. Ryan's opinion clarifies the statute to include assisted-care facilities so long as they are caring for the "aged" who need assistance. The opinion defines "aged" as being at least 55 years old based on language in the Illinois Act on Aging.

Without Ryan's opinion, Mercer County-and perhaps other counties around the state-would have been reluctant to move ahead with such limited care facilities over concern that they Ryan's opinion clears the way for counmight not be statutorily empowered to do

The Arts and Crafts Movement began in England in the 1860's as a protest to the Industrial Revolution. Quickly, it spread to the United States and continued through the 1920's.

During the late 1800's, Americans protested against changes in family lifestyles resulting from the Industrial Revolution. During the revolution, machines produced cheaply-made imitations of hand-crafted furniture, cabinets and other items. Many families were hired from rural homes—in hopes of a better lifestyle—to work in city factories. They found long working hours in unsafe conditions, child labor and poor urban living conditions.

Advocates of the Arts and Crafts Movement believed the Industrial Revolution was responsible for many of the social problems that existed at the time. Followers believed that by reintroducing the arts and fine craftsmanship into family homes, the social problems could be reversed. They believed that homes should be a retreat and a safe haven away from the rest of the world. Constructed of natural and organic materials, homes were functional, comfortable, simple in design and lacking heavy decoration and ornamentation. Furniture, millwork and cabinets were hand-crafted of materials native to the area. Natural wood finishes and construction details were considered the beauty of the craft and were left unadorned.
