

Dear Friends:-



The time has come for me to make known to all of you that I expect to retire from the active ministry at the next session of Rock River Conference, which begins June 19, 1951. It is never easy for any minister to retire, if he loves his work, and especially if he has had as happy an experience as mine has been. Since I was received into the conference 43 years ago, Mrs. Swaney and I have served seven churches, and I had a six year term as district superintendent. In addition I served three years as a student pastor before 1908.

Every appointment was better than I deserved, and the present one to the Barrington Church has been ideal for us. You and all our people have showered us with kindnesses, and it has been a real temptation to remain here in the active ministry for the three more years which the rules of Methodism would make possible.

During the remainder of this conference year, I trust that each of you will do at least a little more than usual to make the work of our church a success. There will be many things to be done in the next two and one half months. Several parents have suggested that I baptize their children, but haven't set dates. A note or telephone call will put this privilege in a definite place on my calendar.

Others have indicated a desire to be received into the membership of our beloved church "later." Let me suggest that already it is "later than you think." It will be a reason for my greater joy in these closing weeks of my active ministry if I may welcome all these into the fellowship of our Lord and his church.

I have only nine more Sundays in which to preach to you. I wish to center these nine sermons in the general theme, "Things Worth Remembering." I hope that every child above the Primary, every youth and adult may hear these messages. Let us make each worship service a joyous occasion. Prof. Don Holter will preach the Thank Offering sermon April 15th.

We expect to move about June 30th to our retirement home in Wheaton, from which I hope to render part time Christian service. When the new minister comes to Barrington be as kind and appreciative as you have been during our four years as your co-workers. Mrs. Swaney and I will always reserve a large place in our hearts for you and the Barrington Church.
